Deferred Payments

Ten per cent with application on or before May 10; ten per cent on July 10; 20 per cent on August 10; 20 per cent September 9; 20 per cent on October 7; 20 per cent on Nov. 11, with accrued interest on deferred payments. Payments in full without rebate of interest may be completed on May 20, if the ten per cent required with application has been paid. Payment may also be completed on any installment date.
