**CHILEAN VISITORS**

A financial commission from Chile has lately arrived in this country, first to visit Washington and then to make a tour of the big American cities investigating business and banking methods.

While comparatively few people of the United States will either see or meet these visitors from our neighboring continent, their visit is really of interest to the entire country. It means a closer binding of two of the great nations of the Western hemisphere, a better understanding of mutual aims and interests.

The prominence which the Monroe Doctrine has been given in the peace settlements makes more plain than ever the desirability of such a strengthened friendship.

Such pilgrimages should be encouraged from all the South American countries, and American businessmen can well afford to send such trade commissions to South America as are now traveling through Europe in the interest of better friendship and better business.

South American possibilities have hardly been tapped as yet. The East coast as well as the West offers opportunities for investment and for trade which we cannot afford to overlook. And as the man said in an old play, "The best way to prevent some other man from taking your wife out to dinner is to take her out yourself."

**OUR GREATEST CEMETERY**

The greatest of American national cemeteries is being established in France, north of Verdun, about midway between St. Mihiel and the Argonne forest, the two places where the American army won its most famous victories. The population of that hero city is being assembled. There will be 25,000 men, nearly half of all our war dead, and more than half of those killed in battle.

Our greatest cemetery in this country is Arlington, outside of the national capital, where there are 20,000 men buried, nearly all Civil War veterans. Vicksburg and Nashville come next with 16,000 each. The Gettysburg burial ground, marking the greatest of our Civil War battles, has less than 4,000.

The original intention was to bring back home the bodies of all the Americans who fell in France. The plan has been changed because the task would be difficult, and because it seems more fit and proper to let them lie where they fell, in the soil they died to defend. Theodore Roosevelt preferred this of his son, and most of the bereaved families seem to prefer it.

The cemetery will be an everlasting reminder to France and a bond between the two nations. It will be a place of pious pilgrimage for millions of Americans. The name is difficult. "Romagne-sous-Montfaucon" they call it, and about the nearest an American can get to its pronunciation is "Roman-soo-mong-fo-sung." But inasmuch as it will be a bit of America in France, perhaps they will give it an American name.

"Don't get peevish!" is the motto of the New York Victory Loan workers. It's good advice for the general public, too.
