Decennial Census Coming

WASHINGTON, D. C. May 7.—The Act providing for the Fourteenth and subsequent decennial censuses was signed by the President on March 3. The remuneration, which will be made in January, 1920, is now less than ten months distant; and the Census Bureau already has under consideration the selection and appointment of not to exceed 400 supervisors who will have charge of the 10,000 enumerators. The supervisors districts will in most cases, except in the large cities, have the same boundaries as the Congressional districts. The supervisors, under the law, are to be appointed by the Secretary of Commerce upon the recommendation of the director of the Census.

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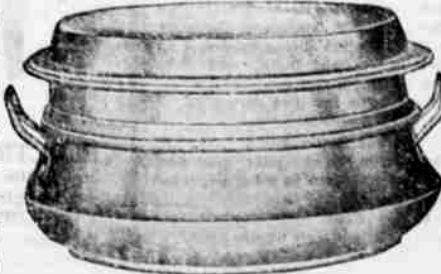

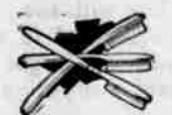
