MEDFORD PEOPLE FIGHTING THE CITY

Property Owners Enjoin City from Buying Property Upon Liens

Medford, Oregon May 19.—Because local newspapers and correspondents have not given the matter publicity, the outside world hasn't been apprised of important litigation in the circuit court of Jackson county—a case that is of decided interest to municipalities generally, especially those interested in street paving matters.

The litigation started when a taxpayer instituted proceedings to restrain the city from purchasing property which had been bid in by the county for delinquent taxes, the county having taken deeds under foreclosure proceedings.

The streets in front of the property in question had been paved for which improvement general mortgage bonds had been sold, a situation which property owners contend invalidates any claim the city might set up against the abutting property.

The city sought to purchase the property—1500 lots and parcels of land—from the county to make good its alleged liens for street pavements. This would have removed about half of the city property from the tax list, doubling the burden of the present tax payers.

The city unsuccessfully tried to have the injunction order modified, but court held there was nothing to show for what purpose the city endeavored to acquire the property and isn't authorized to buy it because it isn't for "municipal or necessary" purposes.

And there the matter rests at present, at the first stage of what seems to be a long-drawn-out and bitter battle between city officials and taxpayer-payers.

ASIA GREAT DANGER POINT

Is Today, and Has Been for All Time, the Home of Plague and Pestilence.

Asia is the home of plague and many other pests. The facilities for travel have brought Asia and our Pacific coast together, while the possession of the Philippines has multiplied the occasions for intercourse with the far east. Thus, says the Journal of the American Medical Association, the diseases of Asia threaten the lives and health of the American population, and the situation has been aggravated by the conditions of war. With the unvarying persistence of bubonic plague in Asia, it seems timely to lay further stress on these points.

The obstacles in the way of successfully grappling with the plague problem in Asia are almost insurmountable. The natives object to wholesale inoculation and rat destruction; hence the only effective mode of procedure is most difficult to carry out. Religious scruples against the slaughter of animals, even vermin, are prevalent throughout India. Consequently it may be taken for granted that plague will continue to persist in Asia, and as it is extremely rife in the two great ports of that continent, Hong Kong and Bombay, it is not an impossibility that it will be conveyed thence to American ports on the Pacific coast. While there is no doubt that our health authorities are awake to the danger, it is well to know that the danger exists in Asia.

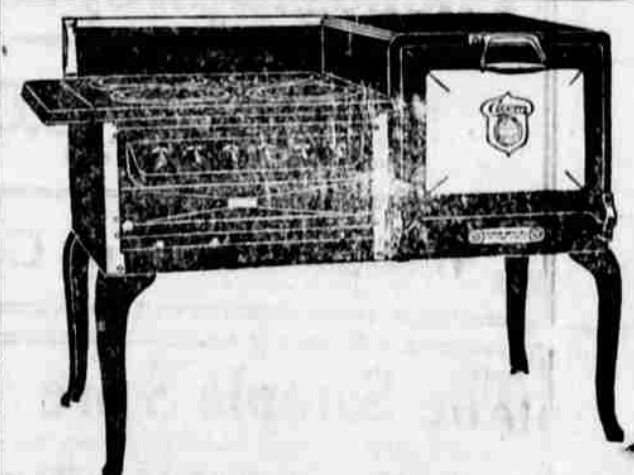
