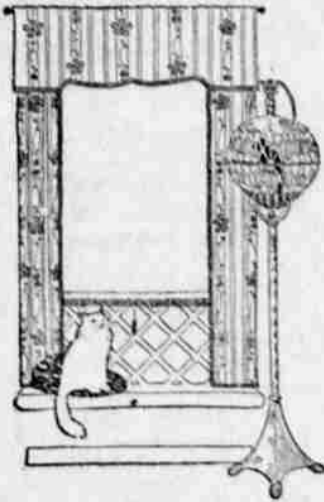

### 'LOST BATTALION' SURVIVOR WORKS IN SANTIAM MILL

SCIO, May 21.—Special.—Probably the only survivor of the famous Lost Battalion in France from Linn county is Chester Hodge, who laughs as he tells of having his pack shot from his back as he lay in a shallow shell-hole expecting every minute to "get his," with nothing to eat but a square of chocolate and loaf of bread for days, and so thirsty he even told his dying buddy beside him: "You're a lucky dog, pal." He expected to be captured as ammunition was very low, but luckily the Huns didn't find it, and Chester is now working in a mill near Waterloo.

C. one and one-half ton is out on a milk condenser route for the Scio condenser and runs by the Wards; also a new Nash Quad is being used to haul to wood from Mell Miller's place.

Schools are almost out at Santiam May 28 and Fairview May 27. Several from each district took the recent eighth grade examinations and are lining to enter high school this fall.

### TRAIN SERVICE IS TO BE IMPROVED

### Railroad Administration Announces New Schedule on Through Trains

SAN FRANCISCO, May 21.—Special.—Details of the improved passenger service which has been ordered into effect between San Francisco, Portland, Tacoma and Seattle were announced by District Director William Sproule for the U. S. Railroad Administration here today.

Commencing June 1 train 53 from Seattle to Frisco will shorten schedule one hour, bringing northern passengers into San Francisco at 9:50 a. m., so that businessmen may have a full day.

Dining cars on all trains. When patronage justifies it, the aim will be to provide two diners for prompt service. Train service is announced as follows:

No. 14 leaves San Francisco at 10:20 a. m., arrives Portland at 10 p. m. This train has sleeping cars for Portland, Tacoma and Seattle. From Portland the service is over the O. W. R. & N. in their train No. 564 which reaches Tacoma at 4:40 a. m. and Seattle at 6:15 a. m.

No. 16 leaves San Francisco at 8:20 p. m. and arrives Portland at 9:15 a. m. with sleepers for Portland.

No. 54 leaves Frisco at 10:20 p. m., arrives Portland 7:20 a. m. with sleeping cars for Portland, Tacoma and Seattle. From Portland the service is over the Northern Pacific in their No. 408 arriving Tacoma at 2:15 p. m. and Seattle 3:55 p. m.

Train No. 53 leaves Portland at 1 a. m., arrives San Francisco at 10:50 a. m. (beginning June 1, 9:50 a. m.). This train has sleepers from Portland, Tacoma and Seattle. From Seattle and Tacoma the service is over the Great Northern in No. 259, leaving Seattle at 3:30 a. m., Tacoma at 5:05 p. m., arrives Portland at 10:50 p. m.

Train No. 15 leaves Portland at 9 a. m. and arrives at San Francisco at 9:50 p. m. with sleeping cars from Portland, Tacoma and Seattle. From Seattle the service is over the O. W. R. & N. in their No. 563 which leaves Seattle at 11:15 p. m., Tacoma at 12:45 a. m. and arrives Portland 6:45 a. m.

No. 13 leaves Portland at 8 p. m., arrives at San Francisco at 8 a. m. This train has sleepers from Portland, Tacoma and Seattle. From Seattle the service is over the Great Northern in their No. 357 which leaves Seattle at 12:30 p. m., Tacoma at 2:05 p. m. and arrives at Portland at 7:10 p. m. Under this program all Shasta

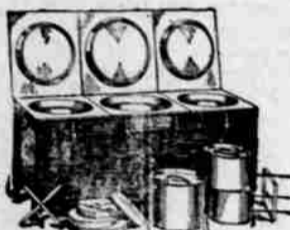

### NARROW TREAD ON TIRES ARE GOOD

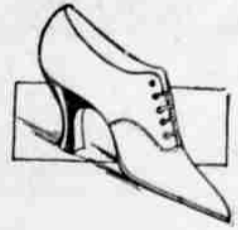
