STURDY PIONEERS HALE AND HEARTY IN EASTERN LINN

One of the Democrat proprietors recently visited some of the old pioneers of Eastern Linn county. In Jordan Valley, one of the beautiful and fertile valleys of the county, which was among the first to be settled, but few of the old guard of pioneer days remain. However, some are there to tell of primitive days. Haman Shelton Sr., the youngest and sole survivor of the old stock of the Shelton family, has lived on the same farm since 1847. Except about two months in the mines of Northern Idaho. Mrs. Evaline Shelton, the widow of William Shelton, is now 94 years of age and lives alone in a cozy home near the Jordan store. Mrs. A. M. Shelton, widow of the late 'Alph' Shelton, crossed the plains in 1847 and resides at Lyons where she has a pleasant home and all the comforts of life. She still retains as a souvenir of pioneer days a single-barrel shotgun with which she has killed eight deer. She is now 83 years of age and has the pleasing faculties of a person much younger.

Another worthy pioneer lady who resides on the old homestead in what is known as the Blue Den on Burnester creek is Mrs. Nancy Bilyeu, who is about 80 years of age and reported to be a pioneer of 1852. She is the widow of L. J. Bilyeu, who, in his day, was commonly known as 'Long John.'
