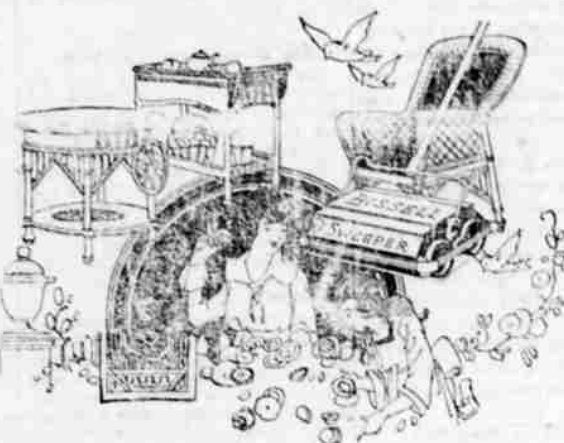
Mr. Henry Baldwin and Miss Anna Tapper were married at the home of
