DO THEY HEAR IT AT HOME?

The teacher had intercepted two notes. One was from Minnie, aged nine, to Bob, the same age. It read "You are an angel Prince." The other was Bob's reply: "You are a d...d fool."

Of course the poor teacher was shocked. Of course she was more shocked at what Bob wrote than at Minnie's milder effusion. But she need not have been. Of the two, Bob's note, take it all in all, was more wholesome.

As a rule the child patterns his conversation on what he hears at home. If the little girl is brought up in an atmosphere of silly sentimentality, learning subconsciously the sex idea while she is still sexless, she will be a silly little girl, writing soft notes to boys. And probably before life has taught her the sense she should have learned at home, she will have done a lot of things that later she will wish she hadn't.

If she is brought up in an atmosphere where children are children merely, not classified according to sex, and where their comradeship is on the plain common sense basis it should and can be, she will have years of cheerful friendship with the boys she knows, and both will be the better for it.

If Bob, whose tendency is away from girls and gush at the tender

age of nine, has heard his father call his mother a 'qualified' fool, that is what he will call Minnie. If he hears rough talk and sees discourteous action at home, that is how he will meet the crises in his life.

From the content of the note it is safe to say that Bob is brought up in a better atmosphere of common sense than Minnie, but the chances are that there is something lacking in the home environment of each of them.

THE DAYLIGHT REPEAL

The daylight saving bill has been repealed by congress, but the repeal will not become effective until the end of October, thus allowing the plan for the present season to continue as originally intended.

This is probably the wisest way. With all the admitted defects of the plan, it is well to give it a thorough trial before dismissing it for good. It may be that, when once accustomed to early rising in the summer months, most of the objectors will prefer it, or will at least consent to remain neutral and allow those who like it to have their way. The basic merits and demerits of the plan, too, can be better judged after experience with all the changing conditions of weather and work in the period under consideration, from the middle of spring up to the middle of fall.

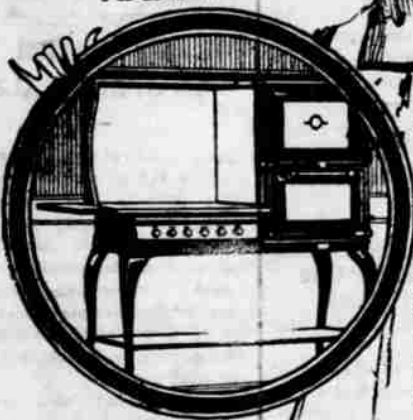
