EUROPE IN 16 HOURS

Everybody with any knowledge of aviation progress or any faith in human courage and endurance knew that the Atlantic would be crossed at one flight as Alcock and Brown have crossed it. Few people, though, believed the time was at hand when such a passage could be made in 16 hours. The shortness of the time required is perhaps the most wonderful feature of this wonderful achievement.

It brings America and Europe as close together by air route as New York and Chicago are by railroad.

Flying to be sure is as yet far from being as safe and dependable as riding in a Pullman car over a good roadbed behind a modern locomotive. Perhaps it never will be. But what is already accomplished gives promise of far more rapid developments than most persons have expected.

The American naval fliers succeeded, in their three jump flight, on the first trial. Hawker, the pioneer one jump flier, almost succeeded. Then came Alcock and made the trip at this amazing speed, in weather conditions which, except for a favoring wind, were about the worst conceivable.

In this brief pioneering period there has been no loss of life. Machines have been lost or damaged, but that may be considered a minor detail. The thing has actually been done. The way has been shown. It remains only to make the airplanes somewhat steadier, safer and less dependent on weather. This is purely a question of engineering development along lines already laid down.

It involves no flight of imagination to say that within a very few years it will be a common thing for tourists to fly across the Atlantic, in comfort and comparative safety, in 12 to 15 hours, or say from New York to London in 15 to 20 hours.

"Who is the most insignificant fellow?" asks Ed Howe's monthly, and suggests the chorus man for first, with the plumber's assistant for second place. But how about the groom at a wedding, or father when mother has made up her mind?

GOOD SENSE MAKES WATER SAFE

It is unfortunate that summer, when everyone is most tempted to get into the water, so often proves to be the open season for drowning. The fact is the more deplorable because most of these accidents are preventable. They arise either from

carelessness or panic. And still people blame the water, instead of recognizing the real difficulty and seeing to it that every child learns to swim and to conduct himself when in a boat so that any danger of capsizing is minimized.

Only a fool rocks a boat. No one changes his seat in a small boat out in open water except from necessity, and he should know how to do it.

Learning to swim, learning to move carefully in a boat, learning that immersion in the water need not mean drowning, but that panic probably will, are steps toward a safe and sane enjoyment of the water in summer time.

Why not ratify the treaty, including the League of Nations, giving the thing a trial, and if it proves unsatisfactory, withdraw from the League later, according to the provision made in the constitution of the League?
