STINGY AVIATION POLICY

The attitude of congressional committees on the air service appropriation bills is disappointing. The naval air appropriation for the next fiscal year has been cut from \$35,000,000 to \$15,000,000. The department experts declared that they had already cut their estimates to the bone in submitting the former figure, but the committee proceeded nevertheless to swing the ax. The army aviation bill was slashed still more ruthlessly. The department's estimate of \$83,000,000 was cut down to \$15,000,000.

In both cases the experts say that if committee reports are sustained it will be barely possible to keep the service going as it is, without making any provision whatever for engineering, research and experimental work to improve existing types of machines and develop new types.

France, despite oppressive taxation burdens, has a budget of \$220,000,000 for aviation. England has provided \$332,000,000 for her air service next year.

The American people do not relish heavy taxes, but neither do they want to be regarded in so important a matter as this. The weakness and backwardness of the American aviation service at the beginning of the war was a scandal. The United States is only now entering upon its rightful heritage of prestige and power in the air.

The successful transatlantic flight of the naval officers filled every citizen with pride and satisfaction. A start has been made toward justifying the original promise of this American invention. Americans are acknowledged to be the best flyers in the world and the best engineers. The science and art of flying are in their developmental period. The next year or two will determine whether America shall lead the world in aviation, or sink to its prewar position of contemptible inferiority.

The public is no 'piker.' Let congress handle this big enterprise with the liberality it deserves, and do its

cutting in some very important branch of expenditure—preferably in the wide domain of congressional 'pork.'

The U. S. senate feels just as bad about that treaty as Germany does. But not for the same reason.

No successful revolution will ever be pulled off in America by planting bombs under front porches.
