## Hackleman Park Discussed

The question of buying Hackleman Park for the city was discussed. Councilman Calavan reported that a straw vote at his store showed all in favor of the park but some thought the price too high. The result now is 27 for and 23 against. It was stated that the owners can get double the price asked, \$9,800, by selling the land privately, and the opinion was expressed that unless the city acted soon the offer would be withdrawn and other use made of the land.

Street Superintendent Glen Jankin reported that several streets in the city need repair and advocated having the work done at once.
