### NO LABOR PARTY

The American Federation of Labor has wisely decided to oppose the formation of a definite labor party in this country. The decision is in line with the history and traditions of the federation itself, which has long sought to accomplish its aims by exerting its influence within the existing parties rather than setting up a separate organization.

Its policy is harmonious, too, with the general spirit of the country. Every attempt ever made toward a political group along purely industrial or economic lines has failed. The so-called 'working classes' seem to get along pretty well in some other countries with their own parties—England for example—but American sentiment is against it.

The difference is probably due to the greater opportunity existing in the United States, the lack of definite boundaries between social classes—the flexibility of American life, the obvious fact that any man with the necessary ability can by his own efforts win a place in any class he desires.

Most American workmen do not seem to feel any such sense of class spirit as is felt abroad. They think of themselves not as a limited group of workers, but as self-respecting members of society in general. Thus they are willing to entrust their interests to parties including many other groups besides theirs. And to the credit of the big parties it must be said that, in general, they justify this faith to the satisfaction of the working people.

Just as long as they continue to do that, the working people will remain with them, recognizing that their interests run parallel to the interests of the big public of which they are a part.

### HOLLAND'S AIR SHOW

There is to be a great aviation show in Amsterdam this summer. Flyers from all over the world, except Germany, have been asked to come and do daring stunts. Makers of all sorts of aircraft, except Germans, have been invited to exhibit their goods.

Prizes will be offered for skill in operating machines and for the best types shown. Altogether, Holland plans to stage the finest air exhibit the world has ever seen.

Probably Holland feels an especial claim upon the interest in aircraft, for has she not made use of air machines for centuries? But what will her staid old windmills think as they see their flightier brethren not only spread their wings, but fly away? Perhaps they will tug at their foundations, wishing like Riley's little boy that they, too, could "let fly an' everything." Maybe they will hug closer to the ground, and as they watch the sirmen circling and spinning will murmur, "All very well, but you should have seen the royal fugitive long long ago when he seized the arms of the windmill and was drawn up into the air as his pursuers dashed by below."

Yes, Holland has had her traditions of the air these many years.

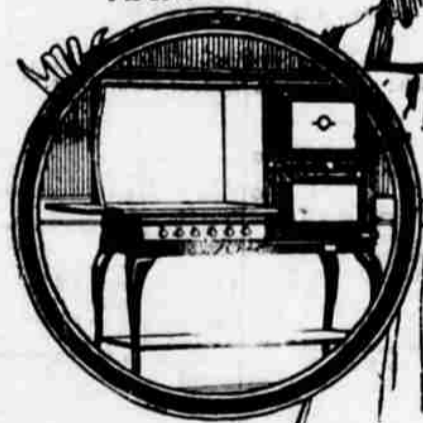

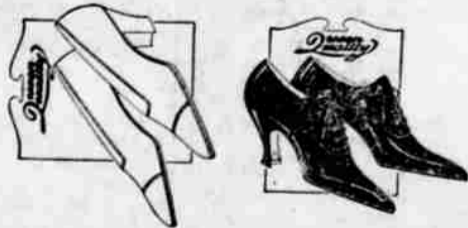
