## MECHANICS MUST TAKE EXAMINATION

NEW LAW REQUIRES AUTO MECHANICS TO PROVE ABILITY

That the motorist may be protected from the inefficiency of untrained automobile mechanics and repairmen, and that craftsmen may be protected from inefficient competition, the state board of auto mechanics examiners, created by the last legislature, is distributing application blanks looking to the early examination and licensing of every auto mechanic in the state. The examining board will have its headquarters in Portland, box 761. Applicants for examination may secure blanks from County Clerk R. M. Russell or from local garages. Examinations will be held later in 15 centrally located cities in the state and will cover various specialized activities of auto trades as well as the usual lines of motor repair work. Applications must be filed before July 5. The board will examine with written, oral and manual tests, prepared, Pres. Bogross declares, in an understandable manner, and the applicant may be examined in any or all subjects for which he, in his opinion, is qualified. Upon completion of the tests the applicant will be rated according to his ability in at least three classes.

Deeming a purely theoretical examination unfair to many excellent mechanics who have had no theoretical training, such tests will be omitted. Mechanics who fail to take the examination will be subject to a penalty of \$100. The examination fee will be \$5.

**Business Women Federating.** The first national convention of business women of America will be held in St. Louis, Mo., July 14. One of the important subjects to be discussed is housing for business women. This convention is a step toward the federation of business women. Behind the movement is a national committee of keen business and professional women, representing every section of the country, with headquarters at 600 Lexington avenue, New York city. Lena Madonia Phillips is the executive secretary of the federation.

## JUDGE BINGHAM STARTS REFORM IN CITIZENSHIP

Judge George G. Bingham, of the circuit court for Marion and Linn counties, is responsible for a movement that has become nationwide. Last year he became discouraged while hearing applications for citizenship in the United States and he issued a request to the teachers in Linn and Marion counties to give instruction in the fundamental subjects. The request reached the bureau of naturalization of the department of labor and was thought so good that the department has issued students textbooks and teachers' manuals for the benefit of foreigners seeking admittance as citizens of this country. The books cover all subjects required for citizenship and outline a thorough course of study. One man who failed miserably in his first examination and cursed the court, recently came back and answered all but two of the questions propounded by Judge Bingham after studying the textbook.

## SEES PICKWICK AS JOHNSON

Canadian Writer Believes Dickens' Famous Character Was Sketch of the Great Lexicographer.

A discussion has arisen between E. R. Thompson in the Nineteenth Century and a writer in the Toronto Mail and Empire as to whether Dickens' famous character of "Mr. Pickwick" is an adaptation of the personality of Dr. Samuel Johnson. The magazine writer holds that this is the case; that the novelist was inspired by James Boswell's "Life of Johnson" and that the alleged plagiarism is proved by a certain characterization of Pickwick which coincides almost to a word with one of Boswell's descriptions of Johnson.

The Toronto writer believes if Dickens did copy his character from the noted lexicographer he did it unconsciously and without any attempt to steal the fruits of Boswell's writing. It is admitted that there are many points of resemblance between Pickwick and Johnson. Both were rather portly, burly men. They had a common weakness for the use of roundabout and dignified speech; both had little difficulty in summing up immense reserves of dignity to suppress the impudent or the flippant, and both had great hearts.

"But," says the Mail and Empire writer, "we have not the imagination to picture Doctor Johnson disporting himself on skates after the fashion of Mr. Pickwick, and there is a sort of kindly credulity about the latter that we find distinctly lacking in Johnson. Moreover, we never suspect Mr. Pickwick of being a bully, although it is to be admitted that when he orders the skates of Mr. Winkle to be removed he shows a Johnsonian sternness and impatience with pretense."
