ALBANY IS READY

offer the finest demonstration of kind ever seen here. The parade will contain 41 platoons in the five divisions. Military, civic, fraternal, business and private organizations have joined in making it a great success.

Parade Forms on First Street
The parade will form on East First street and the route will take it west to Ferry, south to Fourth, east to Broadalbin, south past the reviewing stand to Fifth, east to Ellsworth, north to Second and east across Lyon street, where it will break up.

In the reviewing stand will be county and city officials, G. A. R. veterans with the colors and a color guard, and J. S. Van Winkle, who will announce each feature as it passes by.

The parade headquarters will be at the courthouse. Kenneth Bloom and Roy Eastburn, overseas veterans, will be dispatch-bearers and proceed ahead of the parade to clear the route.

Many Features Included
Col. Willard L. Marks is marshal of the day and will head the parade with his aides, Captain A. B. Coates of the army, and Captain L. A. Wood of the navy.

The fathers and mothers of the fighting men will be represented by Mr. and Mrs. P. D. Gilbert and Mr. and Mrs. O. A. Archibald, who had five and four boys in the world war respectively. They will follow in autos. Next will come an army bugler followed by three overseas noncommissioned officers with the colors. Then will come the various sections of the parade as outlined in yesterday's paper.

Veterans to March
One of the big features of the parade will be the appearance of veterans of the world war. Lieut. Clarence Collins reports that he has had a large number of promises from men and expects hundreds from all parts of the county. The overseas men are requested to wear their steel helmets and gas masks. Ensign Henry Fish reports that a large number of sailors and marines will also be present.
