RIOTING IN STRIKES

The Democrat is pleased to note that there has been no violence or roughness on the part of local telephone company employes during the present strike. It is this feature of strikes which disgusts the public and turns the sympathy of the people at

large from those trying to gain their ends. A few radicals in a crop of strikers can do more mischief than the more sane and sensible members of the organization can undo. The Democrat believes in the cause of the strikers, but would deplore any act which would turn the general public against them. The local electrical workers and operators unions have conducted themselves in a sane manner thus far, but they face a danger of letting the mob inveigle them into dangerous conduct. This should be carefully guarded against. The ends can be far better reached in an orderly manner.

While there was nothing serious in the incidents of the last two nights, yet there was the nucleus of disorder. The crowds sympathizing with the strikers were goodnatured and enjoyed the sport of the evening. But level heads should not allow themselves to be carried away by the more boisterous, amoral and ungentlemanly conduct.

We should always remember that we are living in America, the land of free speech, free thoughts; the best country on earth; and that we have freedom of action just so long as the laws of the country are not transgressed.
