#### FIRES AND GOOD ROADS

The sympathy of the entire county goes out to the people of Brownsville. The devastating fire which swept over the little pioneer city on the Calapoosia, Saturday, destroying business houses and residences, resulted in the destruction of thousands of dollars' worth of property and business was given a severe setback. It will take time to rebuild.

A spark in a cream station did the work. Soon the entire city was endangered, and the greater part of the business district was literally wiped out.

This again brings out the lesson that every city and town should own the very best and most modern fire fighting apparatus that it can possibly afford, and should maintain a well-trained volunteer or paid department. Perhaps a good chemical auto-truck with one paid man on duty would have prevented the enormous loss in Saturday's blaze.

But there is another lesson to be learned. It is not possible for every town and village in the country to possess modern apparatus. Pumps, chemicals, and hose wagons are expensive to buy and more expensive to maintain. Albany is perhaps the only community in the county that can afford a complete department, and, sorry to say, our equipment here is way short of what it should be, considering the many valuable buildings and important industries located here.

But Albany is improving and the city council will undoubtedly authorize the purchase of an auto truck gas pumper in the near future to add to the equipment now on hand. With good roads in the process of construction it would be a paying investment for the county court to contribute proportionately towards the maintenance of the Albany fire department and permit the keeping of enough apparatus and men to send to any part of the county in need of protection.

On paved roads, which will shortly connect Albany and Brownsville, an auto truck can easily make the run in less than an hour. Lebanon could be reached in thirty minutes. This is ample time to protect the rest of the city in case the local departments are not able to confine the blaze, and the saving of thousands of dollars' worth of additional property could be effected.

It is just one more argument in favor of good roads, and an angle that many people have not considered. Albany is, and always has been ready to go to the assistance of her neighbors, but how much better it will be when a fleet auto truck will be able to dash into an afflicted town or village over paved highways, than having to load an old steam pumper on to a slow truck and then bounce along over rough roads and reach the scene after the damage has been done!

#### SPRAY THE COW

The lowering of the milk supply in fly-time is an evil from which the farmer or dairymen need suffer very little if he will spray his cows as faithfully as he does his growing plants and fruit trees.

There are many preparations suitable for these sprays, and formulas for them can be obtained from any county agent or agricultural bureau. Stables should be kept clean and manure piles sprayed with fly eradicators to keep the flies from breeding. If in addition to this, bossy is sprayed frequently herself, she will repay these attentions to her comfort by as steady a flow of milk as her habit when flies are few.

Another precaution against the fly nuisance is the screening of stables as carefully as houses. Of course it would be impossible to keep the fly pest down to as small numbers in the stable as in the house, for manifold reasons; but screening, cleanliness and spraying will do much toward it.
