TRANSCONTINENTAL MOTOR TRAIN

Interest in the U. S. Motor Transport Corps' "Victory Train" will grow as that train rolls Westward. It is on its way from the national capital to the Pacific coast, and in its pro-

gress across the continent will probably constitute the most impressive parade ever organized in this country.

There are 60 motor trucks, of all makes and sizes, loaded to capacity and manned by 209 enlisted men of the transport corps and nine officers.

It is intended as a constructive experiment. The engineers attached to the train are making a careful study of truck efficiency and road and atmospheric conditions.
