COOL WEATHER RETARDED CODDLING MOTH EMERGENCE

Late Worm Crop Calls for Extra Spray for Apples and Pears

O. A. C. Corvallis, July 31.—Special.—Emergence of the coddling moth has been retarded by the cool nights of June, making application of an extra spray advisable to get the late comers.

Climate conditions have likewise been conducive to scab development. On varieties susceptible to scab lime-sulfur 1-60 should be added to the lead spray for worms.

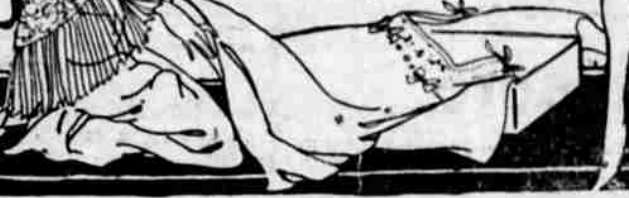
