FRUIT GROWERS OF
STATE IN SESSION

ASTORIA, Aug. 5.—By A. P.—Addresses and discussions of fruit-growing problems in Oregon by growers from the Willamette Valley, Clatsop county and other parts of the state, will feature the 34th annual meeting of the Oregon State Horticultural society, to be held here Aug. 14, 15 and 16. The program for the sessions has just been made public by Ben. S. Worsley, president of the society. Officers of the organization have set 2,000 as the number of members they will try to persuade to attend the convention and the topics for discussion show a wide range.

At the opening meeting Thursday afternoon Aug. 14, addresses will be made by President Worsley, J. O. Holt, manager of the Eugene fruit-growers union, Mayor James Bremner of Astoria and Gov. Ben W. Olcott.

The Friday forenoon session will be marked by addresses by W. E. Schimpff of Astoria on the Cranberry and its Culture in Oregon; and J. H. Butterfield of Brownmeads, on Truck Gardening and Marketing. The afternoon will be given over to an excursion to the Astoria canneries and to Seaside. In the evening, Prof. A. G. Bouquet will discuss Vegetables of Importance in Oregon Coast Counties and H. G. Lechner, county agricultural agent, will talk of the Horticultural adaptability of Clatsop county.

The Future of the Fruit Juice Industry will be told by H. S. Gile of Salem, president of the Pres. Co., Saturday morning. Other addresses will be by John E. Gratzke of Astoria, on the Adaptability of the Soil of Coast Counties for Berry Culture; by Col. Henry E. Doseh, secretary of the state board; by M. McDonald, president of the Oregon Nursery Co. at Oreno, on the Relation of the Nurseryman to the Fruit Grower, and by E. J. Adams of Eugene on Horticultural Development Through the Highways of the State.

At the closing session of the convention Saturday afternoon J. O. of the Canning Industry in Oregon; Louis Eugene will talk on The Future Fruit Canners of the Future. Fruit Union will discuss Fruit Outlook and Marketing Problems; Prof. C. I. Lewis, chief of the horticultural department, O. A. C., will speak on Brambles; C. A. Maibouef on Selling Apples for Cash and A. H. Harris on Will Cooperation Solve Our Problems?
