UNCLE SAM TO PAY EVERY DEPENDENT

Those Who Have Not Yet Received Allotment Should Write

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 12.—By A. P.—Uncle Sam is anxious to pay any dependents of those who joined the army and to whom an allotment was made, but who have failed to receive the allotment.

At Washington the army clerks have been busy with the records of 3,000,000 soldiers, and the individual soldier who sometimes gets tangled up with the great detail of records in his case, has often made a mistake in address, name or other portion of the record, which explains cases where allotments were supposed to have been made out to parents or relatives and no checks ever sent out by the government.

Do not write to Washington if you have failed to receive the allotment, but send a letter to the demobilization camp, Presidio of San Francisco, San Francisco, Calif., asking for the form of a letter requesting deferred allotments. Capt. C. C. Burch, personnel officer of the camp, says that more than 500 allotments have been cleared up in the past two months by this means.

Officers will answer your letter by furnishing a form, which upon being filled out by the allottee must be sent to the adjutant-general of the army as addressed on the form.

This will get a return check! By writing to Washington without sending the form and the information required as indicated on the form, time will be lost by causing too busy war department officials at Washington to write back for additional information. Send and get the form and in forwarding this to Washington the check will be the reply.

ADS IN COUNTRY PAPERS SELL FARMERS' PRODUCE

100 South Dakota Farmers Tell Press Bulletin Man It Makes Them Money

O. A. C. Corvallis, Aug. 12.—Special.—Newspaper advertising of farm products is practical more generally in other Western states than in Oregon, says the college press bulletin. Idaho university bulletins say that many farmers advertise in their local papers and do not consider the cost a waste of money. News bulletins of South Dakota college wrote letters to nearly 100 farmers asking them to give their experience with local newspaper advertising. Some of the answers follow:

"We have been so successful in advertising our seed grains that next year we plan to erect a new granary and get more equipment to clean and

handle grain. We must have a new truck."—Hilcrest Farm, Clark, South Dakota.

"We have found that it pays to use the local papers. The best success is with using those that cover our natural selling territory."—Revolution Farms, Highmore.

"We have been so successful in selling young pigs through local papers that we have been unable to keep up with the demand."—J. M. Tucker, Edmond.

"Yes, it pays to let people know what you've got to sell. People believe an advertisement since they know the editor stands good for its being true."—M. A. Slocum, Ipswich.

"I am sure it paid me to advertise in the local and farm papers. Perhaps a neighbor may want just what you have to sell, and the way to let him know is to advertise it."—Chas. P. McPherson, Sturgis.

"A small ad in our local paper sold all our purebred eggs for hatching. I certainly am in favor of advertising."—Bright Side Farm, Lily.

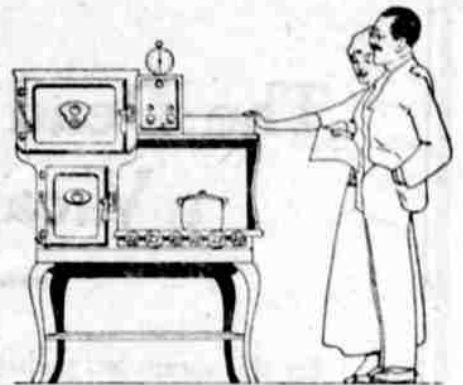
