CARE OF APPLE TREES PAYS WELL

It behooves the apple-grower to be ever on the alert in order to produce fancy or even choice fruit.

I am tempted to give my experience in banding my apple trees, believing it may be profitable to those who have not heretofore practiced this as one way in helping to secure wormless fruit.

About a week ago I tacked bands composed of gunnysacks around the trunks of the trees. Today I made an examination. I found but few worms under the bands that were in the trees which were some distance from buildings. From a tree near the barn I found 20 worms; one near a chicken house 13, and one near the apple house, 53 worms. Could I have had hogs running in the orchard they would have eaten the fallen apples, hence the worms.

When thinning the apples I carried a pail into which I put all wormy apples found. Most of the worms had entered the apples at the calyx end. Yet in giving the calyx spray I tried to do a good job but possibly missed it somewhat at times.

By continuing the use of the bands, by destroying all wormy apples found and by careful spraying, I hope to have comparatively wormless apples

for the market this year. My early apples are wormless.

As a business proposition it pays to take care of the apple trees. Even though you have but one tree. It is a duty you owe to your neighbor who is trying to raise good fruit. Again, you are violating the laws of the state if you neglect to care for your fruit trees. We hear much about the highways and the tourists. Would it not be well to clean house before the company comes? What will the tourist think of the Willamette Valley or rather of the people, when he sees moss-covered fruit trees along the highways and in the cities? Some of the trees look as though they may have been planted by Adam in the year One, and are so since then. Possibly the tourist will think moss-covered fruit trees indicate moss-covered owners. What do you think? Better get after those trees.
