HOLLEY, Aug. 13.—Samuel Marlan McQueen was killed at the Hill & Creamer Logging Camp Aug. 4th just as he was finishing his day's work. A stranded cable broke, knocking him senseless, striking him across the shoulder and face. He lived a short time.

He was born near Holley Sept. 14, 1895. This was to have been his last work in camp. He planned on entering O. A. C. next month.

He leaves to mourn his sudden death his father, Perry McQueen;

his mother, Lizzie McQueen; two sisters, Manda of Holley and Mae Davis of Marcola; four brothers, Francis, of Mable; Allen, John and Hugh of Holley.

He was buried Wednesday at 2 o'clock in the Crawfordville Cemetery, Rev. W. P. Elmore, preaching the funeral and the Odd Fellows burying him. He belonged to the I. O. O. F. lodge at Crawfordville. He was in training seven months at Camp Lewis as a soldier serving his country.
