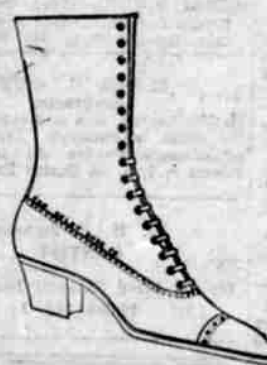
Weather Report—
