SPRAY FOR STING IN SEPTEMBER IS ADVICE OF EXPERT

O. A. C., Aug. 26.—Special.—If Oregon fruitgrowers are to protect their apples and pears from the attacks of crawling moth worms that ruined 18 to 80 per cent of their fruit last year, they will have to have a protective coat of poison on the fruit when the worms emerge for the September 'sting.' This spray says A. L. Lovett, station entomologist, should be applied Aug. 20 to 25 in the Willamette Valley and similar districts. The solution recommended by Prof. Lovett is 3 to 3 1/2 lbs. powdered lead arsenate—twice as much paste—to 100 gallons of water. Every apple and late pear should be thoroughly covered with the spray. Early pears will probably not need the spray unless they are to be left on the trees well into September.

O. A. C., Aug. 26.—Liberty H. Bailey, the country's most noted agricultural investigator and educator, has been invited to speak before farmers' week evening audiences, and has indicated that he will accept. The date for farmers' week has been set for December 29 to January 3.

O. A. C., Aug. 26.—Six graduates of O. A. C. or students duly qualified are eligible for election to the Rhodes scholarships at Oxford, England. No entrance examinations are required for graduates and none in Greek for undergraduates, but the latter will have to fulfill the requirements in Greek for the A. B. degree. All applicants must first obtain the endorsement of the college.

FATHER SUES TO COLLECT WAGES

Complaint was filed in the circuit court today by C. A. Walruff through Attorney Victor Oliver against John Krabill to collect wages which he alleges are due his three minor sons for

services and labor rendered in helping to conduct a hay-baller. The father is the plaintiff under the law because his boys are minors. One of the sons is Oliver Walruff, who was drowned in the river near Albany Aug. 17. A writ of attachment has been issued in the case to collect wages due Krabill for bailing hay for farmers in the community.

Alleged Murderer Indicted
PORTLAND, Aug. 26.—A. P.—The grand jury today indicted Clarence Johnson, former convict, for the murder of Mrs. Eunice Freeman, his elderly benefactress, two weeks ago. He left the city at the time of the crime and is still at large.

YAKIMA, Aug. 26.—A. P.—It is reported that Frank Meredith, former secretary of the Oregon State Fair Board, will be made warden of the penitentiary at Salem. He has been secretary of the Washington fair recently.

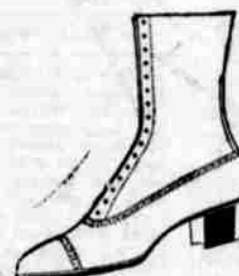
