BETTER INSTRUCTION WRITING the

A county superintendent of schools in California, who by the way is a woman, appointed a county supervisor of writing. The teachers and partial interested in the schools concernd recented this appointment at first, because they felt that it was a reflection upon the way in which writing was handled by the local teachers, and upon the writing of the children to well.

The superintendent hastened to assure them that no such reflection was intended, that the writing of these children is no worse than that of the average, and better than some. But she added that though modern schools may be far in advance of 20 years ago, they are not as thorough in the fundamental easentials as they might be, and any appointments to the teaching force which can help to improve this fault should be welcomed.

Any one familiar with the handwriting of school children, wherever located, knows that on the average it is worse than poor. The teacher who must handle all the routine work of a school often has little time to perfect herself in the best, methods of teaching the extras, and the writing lesson in most schools accomplishes little. No branch of school work needs the direction of an expert more. Anybody can learn to write well, but how many do? And where does the fault lie?

International publicity, indeed, is the thing most needed today throughout the world. Advertising is the best substitute for militarism, and costs incalculably less. But it must be advertising of the right sort—not the kind commonly resorted to. It must set forth, in every country, not the worst features of neighburing and rival countries, but their best features.
