OREGON PINE IN FLAGSTAFF

London, Sept. 9.—Canada's victory flagstaff has been erected on victory mound at the victory gate entrance to Kew Garden—a straight Oregon pine 215 feet high and almost three feet in diameter at the base. It is the gift of the people of British Columbia to London and ranks with the tallest structure in London, Nelson's monument in Trafalgar Square being only 142 feet high, Bow church 222 ft. Stephen's clock tower (Big Ben's home) 320, Victoria tower (House of Lords) 336 and St. Paul's Cathedral 365.

GERMAN WOULD CHANGE STREETS

BERLIN, A. P. (By Mail)—Protest is entered by Attorney Rosenfeld, former Prussian Minister of Justice, that despite the months that have passed since the revolution, the abdication of the Emperor and the overthrow of 30 or more princes and princeling, kings and what-not, the streets of Berlin still bear in inordinately large number the names of royalty.

He cites a few, such as Kaiser Wilhelm street, a Koenig, a Friedrich, a Karl, Prince Louis Ferdinand, Prince and Princess street.

The names of former military leaders and generals should go also, he argues, citing such streets as Zieten, Blucher, Gneisenau, Scharnhorst, Moltke and others. He objects also to the naming of streets after the military, such as the Dragoner, (dragoons) and the Jaeger, (cavalry) in these piping days of revolution and republic.

RED SOLDIERS SURRENDER ARMS

COPENHAGEN, Oct. 6.—A. P.—General Denikenines troops are within 30 miles of Orskov road to Moscow and the Bolsheviks, who have been opposing him are surrendering in great numbers, a wireless dispatch says.



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
