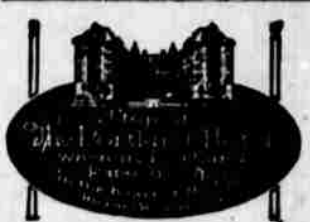

IDAHO PLAYERS LAID UP WITH MINOR INJURIES

MOSCOW, Ida., Oct. 10.—By A. P.—A calamitous succession of minor injuries has caused the shelving of the powerful University of Idaho backfield which had begun to inspire unwonted optimism among Idaho football fans. Probabilities are that the combination Coach Bleamaster had intended to use against Oregon will not be able to perform again for at least two weeks.

Captain Ralph Breshers of Caldwell, quarterback, has a badly strained right arm; "Turk" Gerlough, veteran back and former star of the Thirteenth division team, has a well-developed "charley horse"; Roy Thompson of Boise, fullback, is nursing a wrenched knee and Neil Irving of Rupert, fourth member of the offensive quartet, is kept on the sidelines by a severely bruised hip.

SAVE TOMATOES BY CANNING OR IN RELISHES

Only red, ripe, round tomatoes should be picked from the vines for canning, rather than partly green ones that may be left standing several days to "ripen," say the Oregonian Agricultural college cookery specialists. The tomato does not develop its characteristic flavor after being picked. Scald, cold dip, peel and pack into sterilized jars, either whole or in large pieces. Fill to within one-fourth inch of top with thick tomato sauce. This helps to keep the tomatoes whole, plump and of good color. The sauce may be used later for soups and the tomatoes for salads. To each pint jar add one-half teaspoon salt and one teaspoon or more of sugar. Sterilize for 22 minutes in hot water bath.

Tomato-Apple Marmalade
Six pounds tomatoes, six of apples and nine of sugar are used with a 50 cent jar of preserved ginger to make tomato-apple marmalade, by O. A. C. cookery specialists. Cook the tomato soft and put through strainer. Cook the apples as for sauce. Boil tomatoes, apples and sugar to consistency of jam, adding ginger just before taking from fire. This will make 12 pints of delicious marmalade.

ENGINEERS EXAMINATION TO BE HELD AT PORTLAND ON DECEMBER 5th, 1919

All applications to take the examination given on December 5th, must be filed with the State Board of Engineering Examiners at least 30 days before December 5th, 1919.
