AN INTERNATIONAL LEAGUE PROPOSED

University of Oregon, Eugene, Oct. 20—An international debating conference for the promotion of inter-collegiate forensics is expected to be formed by the Universities of Idaho, Oregon, British Columbia as a result of negotiation now under way. Oregon is already a member, with Washington and Stanford of a Pacific Coast conference and arrangements are being made with Oregon Agricultural college and Reed College for the formation of a state triangular league. Success of the arrangements under way, says Robert W. Prescott, professor of public speaking in the Uni-

versity, will put debating on a higher plane than ever before on the Coast.

Oregon has selected as her choice for the question to be debated with Washington and Stanford, same phase of the immigration problem.

Meanwhile, intramural debating arrangements have been progressing fast. Every fraternity and living organization on the campus is already entered for the annual tournament; the number is 2.5 as against 16 last year. Preliminary arrangements are virtually completed, and the tournament for campus championship, now held jointly by the Hendricks Hall girls and the men of Beta Theta Pi fraternity, will open after Thanksgiving. More than one hundred students will participate, and credit towards graduation will be given those during the work under coaches selected by the department of public speaking. This will be the first year when credit has been given for intramural debating, and Professor Prescott expects a fine season in forensics as a result.
