SALARY QUESTION COMES UP TONIGHT

The Board of School Directors of the public schools of the city are to hold a meeting at the office of the city superintendent in the senior high school building beginning at 8 o'clock this evening to consider the petition of the teachers of the schools for an advance in salaries and such other business as may come before the meeting.

One interested citizen suggests that every business man should attend and assist in adjusting the strained conditions that exist on the salary question.

School clerk Hackleman has sent out a questionnaire to all the leading schools of the state, of the class of Albany, and less, and has a statistical report of the running expenses of the following towns of the state which will be submitted as a basis to consider the justice of the petition of the Albany teachers: Ashland, Astoria, Bend, Baker City, Corvallis, Eugene, La Grande, McMinnville, Newburg, Oregon City, Pendleton, Roseburg, Salem, The Dalles and Woodburn. The questionnaire answers the following points now at issue: salary of superintendent, principal of high and grade schools, salary of teachers, cost of board and room, per cent of advance made in salaries, salary paid special teachers, tuition of out side pupils in the grades, population of district, assessed valuation of district and the percent of taxation for the year 1918. As far as is known sentiment is back of paying the teachers of the city the average net salary paid in schools of the class of Albany.

FARMERS TO HAVE AN ORGANIZATION

SPOKANE, Oct. 24—Farmers representing the several county and state organizations of Washington will meet here November 24 and 25 in the first called session of the State Federation of Farm Organizations, it is announced by Secretary A. D. Cross.

Primary among the considerations will be affiliation with the national board of farm organizations, the body which is backing the construction of a temple of agriculture at Washington, D. C.

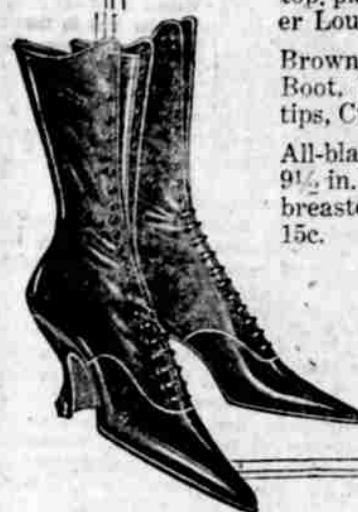

Nine Months on Warship

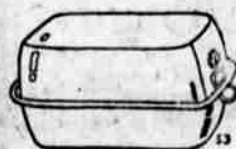
