The enumeration work is to begin the first week in January. The enumerators are paid according to the number of families enumerated and can probably realize from \$4 to \$5

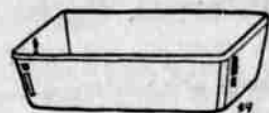
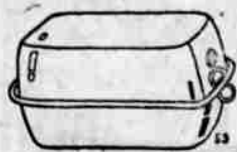
