A number of the farmers were using the good weather sowing grain.

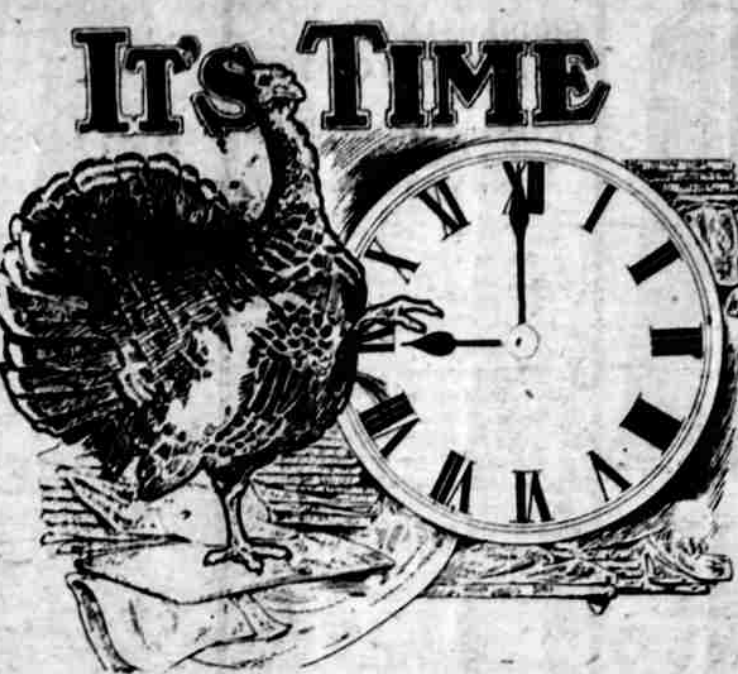
Lindeman Bros. have rented their farm at Griggs station to Roy Snodgrass, of Lebanon, and with have a sale on the 25th.

New Royalist Party Formed in England

LONDON, Oct. 17—A new Royalist Party has been formed in London under the leadership of Captain Wheatley-Crow. It stands strongly for the support of the Monarchy in this country as against republicanism and Bolshevism, for the restoration of the British constitution and civil liberties. The party also wants to see a closer

bond between the King and his people and to this end its leaders think it will become necessary to reorganize and strengthen the House of Lords.
