RUSS REDS DON'T HAVE STRIKES

Leaders Killed First and Invited to Arbitrate Afterwards

LONDON, (By A. P.)—The Communist government at Petrograd has a rather primitive but exceedingly effective method of settling strikes with in its confines, Paul Dukes a British secret agent told the Associated Press. They kill the leader and without leaders probably no workman in the world is so helpless as the Russian.

"Labor leaders involved in a strike have employed many ingenious methods to hide their identity but a large number of them have failed and have been seen no more", Mr Dukes said. "When a strike is called the Communist government tries to find the hidden leader. In most cases he finally is ferreted out and some morning the strikers awake to find their leader gone. Without their organization they are ineffective and generally go back to work under worse conditions than they left."

**LOWLY PRUNE HAS
COME INTO ITS OWN**

Joins Nobility of Dried Fruit Market When Prices Reach 50c Per Lb.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 21—This is a little story of the lordly prune, formerly known as the lowly prune. The Washington housewife who pays 50 cents a pound for a medium grade these days is fully convinced that the prune has taken its place among the nobility of the dried fruit market.

The manager of one of Washington's large retail groceries exhibited quotations of the New York distributors from whom he buys. He paid for stock on hand 31 cents a pound 30-40, and 27 cents for 40-50c. He is retailing these at 45 cents, covering freight from New York and handling charges in the retail trade.

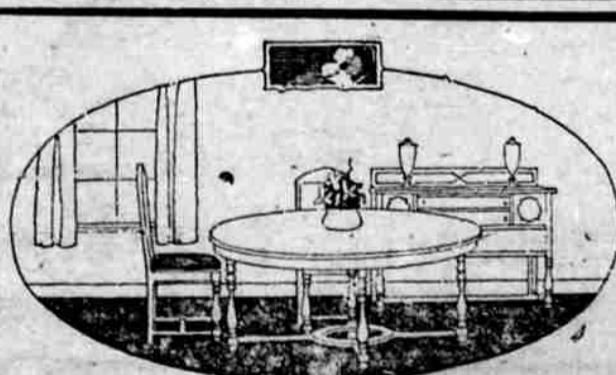
