The crews have been robbed in each case of all their belongings and the cargoes looted.

These up-to-date Turkish pirates, it is said, principally infest the Aegean Sea off the Dardanelles, and the coast of Asia Minor.

CZECHS WILL ENTER OLYMPIA

American Y. Men Coaches Teams of New Republic for Internationals

The republic of Czechoslovakia will be one of the new nations competing at the Olympic Games at Antwerp next year. The news of the determination of the embryo republic to put a strong team in the coming Olympiad was brought to this country recently by E. J. Wright, who returned after more than a year's service in the new nation for the Y. M. C. A.

That the Czechoslovaks will be strongly represented was asserted by Mr. Wright, who also stated that the track and field team was being coached by Joseph J. Pipal, the man who coached the American team for the inter-allied games.

Alaska Raises Much Wheat Nowadays

NENANA, ALASKA, Sept. 26.—(By Mail) Approximately 2,000 bushels of wheat will be harvested this year in the district adjacent to Fairbanks, according to George Markus, head of the store department of the Alaska Engineering Commission. Within a few years, it is believed, sufficient grain will be produced to meet all needs of the district.

Oats hay this season was produced in ample supply for demands, Mr. Markus said, and the potato crop also was satisfying. The Fairbanks farmers have installed a potato grader.

Oregon Agricultural College Corvallis, Nov. 20—Special—The heaviest attendance in the history of Farmer's week at the college is predicted for December 29-January 3. Interest in agriculture in Oregon is said to be greater than ever. War conditions brought about many changes in farming methods. Hundreds of persons from all sections of the state are expected to spend a week in Corvallis for the purpose of getting valuable suggestions to take home with them. A practical program—one that will interest various types of farmers is being arranged.

Courses will be offered dealing with farm crops, dairy husbandry, animal husbandry, soils, horticulture, industrial clubs, home economics, farm mechanics, rural marketing, bee-keeping, and other subjects.

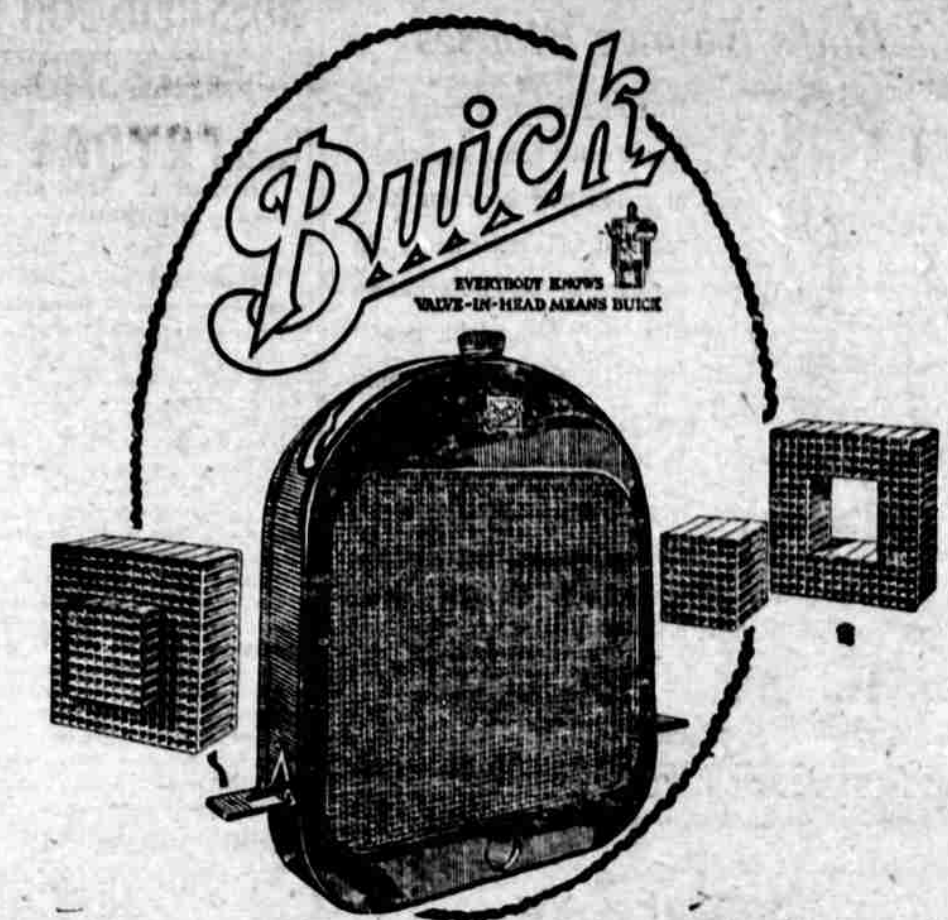
Dry America Joke In Merry England

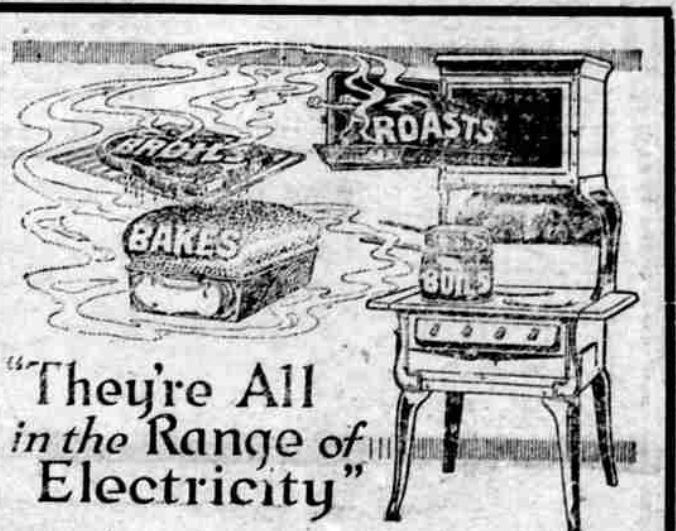
be presented to person suggesting the best name. The name is now being used by the World Trade Club in carrying on its campaign for Unitanian metric standardization.
