## PEAR CULTURE IS IMPORTANT

Proper Spray as Prescribed in U. S. Bulletin increases Profits

WASHINGTON, Dec. 13—The culture of pears in the Pacific Northwest has suffered severe losses from time to time, and its development has been retarded by various insect pests, and by pear scab, a fungous disease, which are not sufficiently understood by the average orchardist. While the scab, to cite the most serious disease, is readily controlled by sprays, it annually causes a heavy loss because of inefficient spraying materials and carelessness as to the time or manner of application. The crop yield is frequently cut from 50 to 75 per cent, and unsprayed fruit is often so unattractive as to be almost worthless.

Through spring and summer spraying of pears for the control of scab has been generally practiced, the results, for the reasons indicated, have often been disappointing, especially when spraying has not included an insecticide for control of insects causing disfigurements that look very much like scab spots on mature pears. To enable the orchardist to recognize and distinguish between these troubles and to provide the proper measures of control, the United States Department of Agriculture has issued Farmers' Bulletin 1056, "Controlling Fungous and Insect Enemies of the Pear in the Humid Sections of the Pacific Northwest," which is for free distribution.
