IRISH DRIVERS GO ON STRIKE

Refuse to Ask Police for
Permits; Motors do not
Run as Result

DUBLIN.—Motor traffic has been
almost completely banished from the
streets of Dublin and numerous other
Irish cities and town as result of the
government's order requiring owners
and drivers of all kinds of automobiles
to obtain permits from the police to
operate their cars.

The automobile owners were willing
to apply for permits, and had no dif-
ficulty in obtaining them, but the driv-
ers, some of whom anticipated failure
to convince the police of their
freedom from Sinn Fein sympathies,
refused to do so. A few owners whose
chauffeurs refused to apply for per-
mits dismissed them, and the men
made a Trades Union matter of it.
They have invited sympathetic
striker by all transport workers.

Controlling Peach Leaf Curl

Professor H. P. Barss, of the De-
partment of Botany and Plant Path-
ology at the Oregon Agricultural
College, states that it is important
for peach growers to put on a good
spray for the control of peach leaf
curl during the winter, any time
from early December to the middle of
February. One good application of
Bordeaux will be sure to do the work
with 100 per cent results. If grow-
ers wait until March, which they for-
merly did in many cases, it will be
too late. Lime sulphur, while some-
times effective does not seem to
give uniformly good results. The
Bordeaux, however, seems to be very
effective.
