YOUR HOSE MAY COST YOU \$250

Rising Price-Tags Noted by Fashion Observers; Cost of Being Rich Felt

NEW YORK—The mother of an 18-year-old New York girl who for several years has kept an account of the cost of her daughter's wardrobe, in a letter to a local newspaper, recently complained about the present prices of clothing, shoes, gloves, hats etc.

Serges, formerly the cheapest and most common dress material and which, before the war, could be bought for \$1 to \$1.25 a yard, are now retailing at \$4 to \$5 for the same quality. Velvetens, another popular dress material, could be bought five years ago for \$1 and \$1.25 a yard and now are bringing \$4.50 to \$5.50. The biggest advances, dealers say, have been in cotton and wool and not so much in silk. Babies' buckskin shoes which normally sold at \$3.50 are now priced at \$7 to \$9 a pair.

\$250 For Hose

Many women of means, the retailers say, are paying as much as \$250 and up for a pair of silk stockings but these are beaded with pearls and are decorated with fine hand embroidery. The public demand for furs, in spite of the advance of 50 to 75 per cent since spring dealers say, is fifty per cent greater this winter than last season. Fur coats costing many thousands of dollars are more in evidence than ever before in New York.

An artist for a New York fashion paper recently sketched a coat, suit

and dress at a local factory, the combined wholesale price of which was \$975. The coat, a coarse wool fabric, was marked \$375, the georgette dress at \$275 and the suit at \$335. Here were three garments which, sold at retail would cost the buyer at least \$1,500, it was said. Such instances in Fifth avenue shops of how the high-cost-of-living has hit the rich are by no means rare. One window displays a rose white blouse for \$3,500.

\$85,000 For a Coat

"Untold millions are being invested in furs this year by American women," said J. W. Argenbright, a Brooklyn importer, "and the demand is less exclusive and more widespread than ever before, showing that prosperity is general. Coats costing from \$50,000 to \$85,000 are uncommon but they are being bought."

Maxwell Appears Before The State Accident Commission

J.S. Maxwell of 4th and Main street left for Salem this morning to appear before the State Accident Commission today. Mr. Maxwell sustained a broken leg in a saw mill accident at Brownsville on the 23 of last April and has not yet recovered sufficient to resume work. The commission granted him 60 per cent of his salary for the first six months and at the expiration of the six months reduced the amount to \$41 per month which is not sufficient, according to Mr. Maxwell's statement to support his family.

DIVORCES TO BE PROBED

Lane County Prosecutor to Appear Where Children Are Involved

EUGENE—Every divorce case filed in Lane county hereafter in which children are involved will be contested, according to an announcement of District Attorney L. L. Ray. Complying literally with the statutes the district attorney said that he will enter his appearance in all cases where the welfare of children is at stake.

"More than one-half of the boys and girls who come up before the juvenile court in this county are members of families in which divorce has been granted," said Mr. Ray, "and I believe that if a lot of these cases are contested it will prevent separations and have a tendency to lessen the number of juvenile cases."

Mr. Ray says the 85 per cent of the girls in the state industrial school at Salem are from homes that were broken through divorce proceedings.

WATER RIGHT IS REQUESTED

Roseburg Files Application for use of North Umpqua River Power

ROSEBURG.—Preparatory to installation of a municipal light and water system, the city of Roseburg, through its officials, yesterday filed with the state engineer an application for water rights and approximately 100 feet per second of water from the North Umpqua at a point known as Whistler's bend.

Construction of a dam 15 feet high across the stream, about 800 feet wide at this point, where rapids exist will give a 40-foot fall, creating thousands of horsepower for the plant, according to Mayor Hamilton. The plan is to build an electric power house at that point, and then negotiate with the Douglas Light & Water company for purchase of the Winchester pumping plant and the system now supplying water to the city.

Teacher About to Wed, Commits Suicide

KLAMATH FALLS—Miss Bessie L. Lewis, 25 years old, a teacher in the Klamath Agency schools, committed suicide by drowning in the spring which supplies water for the agency.

Miss Lewis formerly resided in Brooklyn, N. Y., where her parents live. She was to have been married within a month to a forest ranger at the reservation.

STATE SONG IS DESIRED

Oregon Composers Ask Submission of Verses in Contest for Piece

The Society of Oregon Composers has instituted a movement for the purpose of selecting a state song for Oregon and it invites the poets from all sections of the state to contribute a poem suitable for that purpose. All poems should be sent to the Secretary, Daniel H. Wilson, 613 Bush and Lane Building, Portland, before January 31, 1920, when the contest closes.

The words of the song should be poetic in sentiment, correct in form, breathing of patriotism and pride in state, touching on its natural beauties and early history, all so poetically and deftly woven as to produce a song which the people will take to their hearts for generations yet to come. When the successful poem is announced by the judges, who will be asked to compose music to the words, and it is hoped by this means that a song in words and music worthy of Oregon will be obtained.

INVENTION WILL SUPERSEDE GAS

Atmospheric Power Generator Will Revolutionize All Power Plants

The invention of Alfred M. Hubbard the 19-year-old Seattle boy, is attracting wide attention, and his atmospheric power generator is being described by leading electrical periodicals and newspapers in all sections of the United States.

By a simple rewinding process the boy has transformed a common everyday motor into a generator that exceeds its stated horse-power, and the power is developed from the skies, or unknown sources.

Peace Treaty Ratification Set for Jan. 10

PARIS, Jan. 6.—A. P.—There is every indication now in Supreme Council circles that the peace protocol will be signed by Germany and ratifications of the treaty of Versailles exchanged January 10, the date set tentatively by the council yesterday. The council of the league of nations, it is understood, will be called to meet about a week later.

County Expenditures Nearly Half Million

Expenditures of Lane County during the year 1919 were practically \$33,000 greater than during the previous year notwithstanding that in 1918 nearly \$40,000 was expended in the erection of an addition to the courthouse, this money coming from the Oregon California railroad back tax money the Register reports.

The biggest individual increase during 1919 was in the expenditures for roads and highways, over \$50,000 more being expended during the past year than the year previous. Another good sized increase was in the expenses of the circuit court. The Clark murder trial was in a measure responsible for this.

In the erection of bridges the county expended several dollars more than it did in 1918 and the offices of the assessor, the county school superintendent, the sheriff and the commissioners' court showed increases.

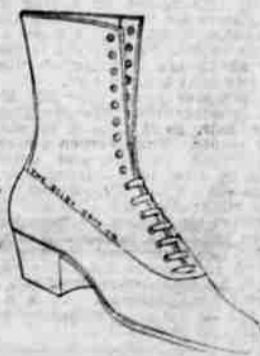
