### AUTO TRUCK USED TO HAUL LOOT

#### Other Indictments Returned; 16-Year-Old Girl is Involved

**SALEM**—Four indictments were returned by the grand jury which adjourned Saturday. A two-count bill was returned against Frank Wagner, charging burglary. Both charges were in connection with Wagner's alleged attempts to carry away the contents of the Julius Alum and Syring-Banks stores at Silverton on July 15, 1919. In this burglary, it is said that an auto truck was used by Wagner in removing groceries and other merchandise from the Silverton mercantile establishments.

The second indictment is against John Wyatt, charged with a statutory offense. Wyatt is a Silverton machinist. A 16-year-old girl is the principal witness for the prosecution.

Elvis Pulley and Norman Owens are charged with larceny in another indictment. Pulley and Owens are two youths who live near Hubbard and who are charged with the theft of 900 pounds of clover seed from the Peter Smith farm near Hubbard.

### Higher Salary for Superintendent of Schools is Sought

An increase in the salary of the state superintendent of public instruction "to such a sum as will be commensurate with the dignity and duties of his office," is urged upon the state legislature in resolutions adopted by the association of county school superintendents in session here Saturday afternoon.

Irvine, editor of the Oregon Journal, who sounded a warning against the "spree of speeding" upon which the nation is engaged today and which he declared must have its "day of settlement" in which the savers of today would prove the country's salvation. ### Kincaid Park to be Bird and Game Refuge

Deeds have been filed for the sequestering of 600 acres of land between Eugene and Springfield for a period of five years by which the land will become a refuge for wild birds, reports the Guard.

One tract of 500 acres has been leased to Carl D. Shoemaker, state game warden, which includes Kincaid park and an addition to the park, excepting that portion which is owned by other parties than H. R. Kincaid and wife.

The lease for the 100 acre tract is dated Nov. 18, 1919, and also places land adjacent to Kincaid park in the tract which is to become a wild bird and game refuge for five years.

### MOTORCYCLES TO GO UP SKINNER'S BUTTE

#### Clyde Fisk Announces Butte to Be Famous Through Annual Contest

In the climbing of Skinner's butte New Year's day, Clyde Fisk has established an annual event that in another year will bring to Eugene all the leading motorcycle drivers of the valley who happen to be ambitious to make a record. In fact, Mr. Fisk believes that for this part of the valley the annual climb will become one of the sporting events of the year, just as such affairs attract motorcycle men in southern California.

The Harley-Davidson entered by Mr. Fisk for the climb was ridden by Bill Fisk, the shop foreman. The Henderson N. the contest was driven by Gale Smith.

In making the climb, the start up the butte was made just above the McMurphy house, then straight to the road, then 50 feet along the road and the long stiff climb to the top of the butte. Mr. Davis on the Harley-Davidson made the last lap of the climb in 35 seconds, climbing straight up. In order to hold, tractor wheel was used for the rear wheel.

The first half of the pull up the butte has a grade of 59 percent while the second half, after leaving the road has a much longer pull with a grade of 43 percent.

Mr. Fisk says that only once before has a motorcycle climbed Skinner's butte and that was in 1914 when Mr. Fisk himself made the climb. The event attracted a number of Roseburg sportsmen.
