ALBANY HOTEL IN GOOD CONDITION

Annual Meeting Held Yesterday Shows Financial Condition

The annual meeting of the stock holders of the Albany hotel was held yesterday at the close of the sixth year in business and with the best record since the building was constructed.

During the last year the directors have reverted the outstanding indebtedness of \$30,000 into first mortgage 10 year bonds which have all been taken up by Albany people and the hotel is now on a substantial paying basis to the stockholders. Fifteen thousand dollars has been applied in improving the upper story and the office fixtures since the building was built.

At the beginning of the present year all outstanding floating indebtedness has been paid and the stockholders are to expect a substantial dividend each year from this time on.

The Albany Hotel is recognized as one of the best in the state and has been a strong factor in promoting Albany in the minds of strangers who frequent the city. The building originally cost \$83,000 and is now considered to be worth at least \$125,000 by the owners.

A vote of thanks was extended to B. R. Westbrook, the rustling proprietor, by the board of directors for his efficient management of the hotel during all these trying years. 1917 and 18 were the days that put the hotel man to the test according to a statement of one of the directors.

J. B. Thompson, C. C. Cameron, R. D. Snell, Chas. Burgraff and W. A. Eastburn were the board of directors re-elected for the ensuing year.

Spanish War Vets Meet at Armory

The Spanish war veterans of this part of the state met in annual session last night at the armory with the department officers present and elected and installed officers for the ensuing year. A fine banquet was served by the ladies and a social evening spent. Dr. Hyde of Hillsboro was among the out of town visitors.

Growth Shown By Statement Issued by Bank

Although this is usually not the time of year to show gain in banking resources, the statement issued by the First National Bank yesterday in pursuance to a call from the U. S. Comptroller of Currency and published elsewhere in this paper, shows a gain of \$23,979.92 over the statement of November 17, 1919. The resources of the bank at the time of last statement were \$1,326,717.82, while yesterday's report showed \$1,350,697.75. The bank is holding its annual meeting today and officers for the coming year are being named.
