ARMENIAN TO SPEAK TONIGHT

General Mesrop Azgapatian to Address Local People at Baptist Church

The eminent Russian, General Mesrop Azgapatian will visit Albany tonight and will address the people at 8 o'clock at the Baptist Church.

While in Seattle the famous Rotary Club there refused to allow him to stop speaking until an hour after closing time.

Dr. W. B. Hinson sent the following telegram to Rev. G. H. Young this morning: "General Azgapatian spoke in my church this morning. He is magnificent. Any audience that hears him will be greatly stirred. By all means hear him."

Last night he spoke in the white temple and in the Portland Auditorium along with General Pershing, to great audiences, whom he thrilled. Samuel Lancaster the Engineer of the Columbia River Highway will accompany him.

General Azgapatian is an Armenian by birth, a statesman diplomat and soldier. He commanded a division of the old Russian army in the Caucasus and when the empire was overthrown held his division together and saved Armenia from absolute destruction by the Turk. Albany citizens are urged to hear this distinguished visitor tonight.

Williams Funeral Is Held Sunday

The funeral of the late Silas Williams was held Sunday from the Fortmiller Funeral Chapel. Following the services the body was shipped to Salem and buried in Warren, formerly Mt. Hope cemetery. Mr. Williams died Friday at a ripe old age at his home east of this city. He was long active in religious work in Linn County and was one of the best known Baptist ministers in this part of the state.

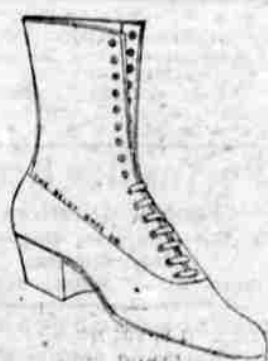

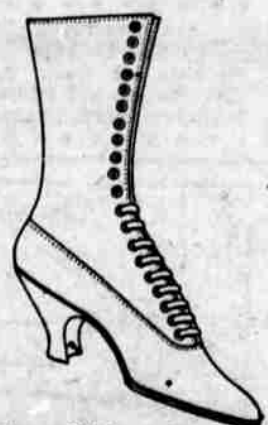

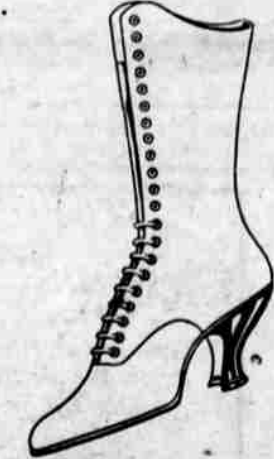
