## EMERGENCY REGULATIONS PASSED BY THE STATE BOARD OF HEALTH TO COMBAT THE SPREAD OF INFLUENZA

HEADS OF FIRMS, SCHOOLS, HOMES, ETC., HELD RESPONSIBLE FOR QUARANTINING AND REPORTING CASES; HEALTH OFFICERS CHARGED WITH KEEPING IT UNDER CONTROL.

The State Board of Health, at a special meeting held in Portland, on January 24, passed emergency rules and regulations which are deemed adequate to cope with the epidemic of so-called Spanish Influenza. These regulations, are briefly, to the effect that all persons occupying a position to which other persons are subordinate, and under their control, shall report all cases of Influenza occurring among their subordinates and all persons who have suspicious symptoms to the Health Officer having jurisdiction, and shall refuse to permit such persons to remain at their work so long as such suspicious conditions exist, being responsible for those under their control pending action by the Health Officer, or other

physician. \*All persons, whether physicians, practitioners, healers, owners or keepers of rooming houses, hotels, restaurants, boarding houses, dairy farms, superintendents or managers of private or public hospitals or sanatoria, visiting nurses, heads of schools, teachers in common and Sunday schools, and heads of households are required to placard premises and immediately quarantine all cases of so-called Spanish Influenza, and report to the health officer all circumstances which would reasonably cause one to suppose that a case of Spanish Influenza might be developing, carefully informing the Health Officer having jurisdiction over the habitation or place of employment, or resi-

dence of the person infected. Quarantine, in every case, to be strictly maintained until raised by the Health Officer.

Health Officers are required to furnish placards and detail instructions to all other persons within their jurisdiction when quarantine is established by such other persons.

There is no known preventive inoculation against the so-called Spanish Influenza. The adequate enforcement of these regulations will be the best known method of preventing the spread of the epidemic, and the Health Officers within their respective jurisdictions are charged with the strict enforcement of these measures.

While the policy of the State Board of Health is against closures of churches, schools, theatres, and other places where public gatherings are held, it does earnestly request the cooperation of the general public in the matter of voluntarily avoiding unnecessary exposures.
