### Cleaning Spark Plugs

An excellent method of cleaning mica, spark plugs, or in fact any mica object, is to wash them in a 10 per cent solution of acetic acid, which is an infallible solvent for grease and carbon deposits. The plugs should then be washed off with gasoline and usually dried by rubbing with a handful of waste or a cloth.

### To Clean Contact Points

It is not always easy to find a really satisfactory agent for cleaning the contact points of ignition apparatus or the surface of a commutator on the starting motor or a lighting dynamo. There is a product known as suttlesh paper which is finer than the finest sandpaper and which is ideal for this purpose. This paper cannot always be obtained at hardware stores, but it is always stocked by dental supply stores.

### Hints to Autoists

#### Stopping a Leak

If you have a leaky radiator or an obstinately leaking pump packing, add a small amount of shellac to the denatured alcohol used in the antifreezing solution. The shellac may also be used in summer in the plain water with which the cooling system is filled during the hot months.

#### Sticking Nuts

If a nut resists all ordinary blandishments, try the following: Heat slightly an ordinary single spanner that fits the nut and let it rest on the nut for a few minutes. The heat transmitted from spanner to nut expands the latter, so that it can usually be run off without further trouble. Do not make the mistake of heating the nut with a blow lamp, as this expands the bolt also, so that the condition is unaltered.

#### Cement

Four parts of iron filings, two of lime, a fifth part of common salt, mixed to a paste by the addition of vinegar, makes an excellent cement for spark plugs, for connecting pipes, etc. When properly compounded this cement will withstand compression and heat and can be air dried.

#### Only Eighth of Roads Improved

According to figures recently compiled in Washington, only one-eighth of the public roads in the United States have been improved. The total length of these roads is 2,478,552 miles, of which 299,138 miles are improved with some form of surfacing.

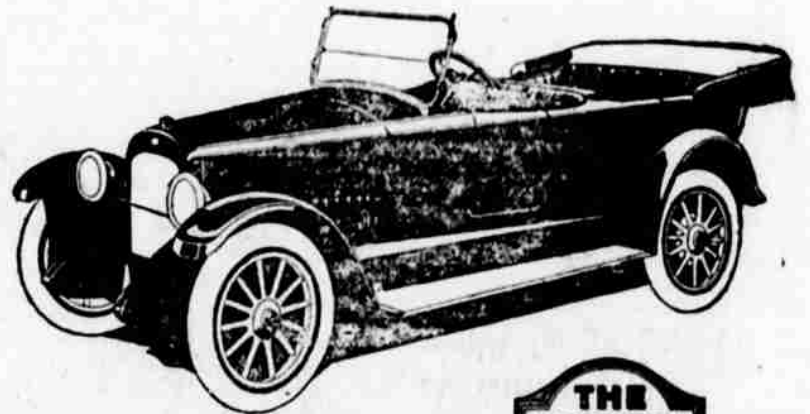
