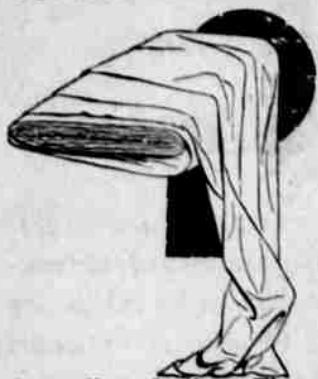

Prairie Grange last week, which is perhaps typical of the program to be adopted in many other localities. The farmers on meeting first had the question to answer, "What should be done for the community's good? The answer was as follows:

"Live Stock Improvement Club organized with H. J. McInnis as chairman; A Silo Club was organized with a two fold purpose, first to make an inspection tour of the country to investigate the best method of building silos. This trip is to be made under the direction of Prof. Fitts, of the O. A. C. The second problem under this head was to give the sunflower a trial to be used for ensilage, which has proven in some states to be from 50 to 100 per cent better than corn. A land plaster pool was organized with E. H. Holloway as chairman. All farmers wishing to use land plaster are to pool their order and give the local dealer the first chance on the best price.

A Poultry Culling Club, was also organized with A. R. McCall, chairman. This club is to take the lead in conducting poultry culling demonstrations in the community. It was voted to organize a Canada Thistle club with one of the qualifications of the members being that no thistle would be allowed to go to seed on his farm.

It was also voted to ask the O. A. C. to make a preliminary survey of the community for a drainage district and estimate the cost. The county agent will be found simply in the harness for the next few weeks in making the survey of the county and in assisting in preparing a program in every community desiring to take up community work. Nineteen communities did work last year and more are expected this year. F. W. Kehrli, of Salt Lake City is in the county this week to confer with the farmers of Lacombe and Waterloo sections regarding the advisability of organizing a bull club. Many prominent educators on community problems are expected during the year.

A telegram to this effect has been sent to the Kings of England, Belgium and Italy, presidents of the United States and France and the Emperor of Japan.

The ex-crown prince says: "I want to take the place of my countrymen. If the associated governments desire a victim let them take me instead of 900 Germans who have committed no other crimes than serve their country in war."

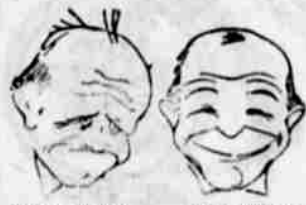
