Memorial Asked by Linn County Citizens For Ex-Service Men

Citizens of Albany are bitterly scored for their alleged neglect of the returned soldiers in a statement issued today by Mrs. R. E. Mason, prominent civic worker and formerly connected with allied war relief work.

Mrs. Mason characterizes the attitude of her townspeople toward the veterans of the great war as indifferent and charges them with being "quitters" in respect toward earlier promises concerning what they would do for the "boys" when they got back.

Critics of the dances which have been conducted by the American Legion for the purpose of raising funds to carry on the expenses of the organization are described as being small mean and unfair. Mrs. Mason defends the conduct that has prevailed at all these affairs.

"Give the returned soldiers a community house as a remembrance in memoriam," says Mrs. Mason addressing her statement toward the residents of the entire county.

"At present," she says, "they are meeting in the most uncomfortable building in town, the armory. The basement is full of water. The air is bad, the building damp and there is no heating apparatus. In fact they can well imagine themselves back in the trenches or at one of the uncomfortable camps.

"If they had a building this next winter they would enjoy meeting there in warm comfortable quarters. There would be a fireplace, books, music and good healthy exercise in a gymnasium and a swimming pool.

"Albany needs such a place anyway. There isn't a nice place in the town to be rented to the people here on special occasions. It is not up to the Legion men themselves. Their hands are tied. They can't build a memorial to their own members. It is up to the home folks.

"Why doesn't some organization take the matter up and get behind the movement and raise the funds for the building. It would go like wild-fire. Let every one in the county put in \$1. No one would miss that amount. We give in response to other appeals and this is for our own boys.

"Practically every other county in the state has done some thing for the boys except this county. Why are we the tardy one?

"This building would be used by the American Legion, the boy Scouts, the camp-fire girls, the woman's club and others. It would fill a long felt for want in Albany.

"Let the whole county get behind this move as one man and boost for the community house. Let's prove to our soldier boys that the promises we made when they left for war were not empty ones.

PUBLIC ASKED TO HOLD JUDGMENT

Maintenance of Way workers Present Their Side of The Case

Officials of the local brotherhood of maintenance of way men in Albany are asking that the public suspend judgment and not criticize their acts until a fair consideration has been given the case after the figures have been studied and compared with the wages paid in other lines of work where equal or less ability and responsibility are required.

Figures furnished by local railway men show the rate of wages which is being paid. Track laborers get forty cents and hour or \$3.30 for an eight hour day. This scale is gradually increased for different classifications up to 74 1/2c an hour which is paid to bridge and building foremen, a job which requires much technical skill and executive ability.

The scale for different classes of work is as follows: Track laborers, 40c an hour; track walkers, 40c; track foremen assistants, 45c; track foremen from \$190.98 per month to \$120.36 per month; the latter figure being paid to foremen of steel laying gangs; bridge and building carpenters, 53c to 63c an hour; helpers 44 1/4 to 47 1/2c; bridge and building laborers, 40c; bridge and building foremen 74 1/2c; assistant foremen 67c; water service men, 53c to 63c; water service helpers, 44 1/4c to 47 1/2c; water service laborers, 40c.

The above applies to Portland Division, S. P. System.

EXEMPTION GRANTED SPECIAL CLASSES

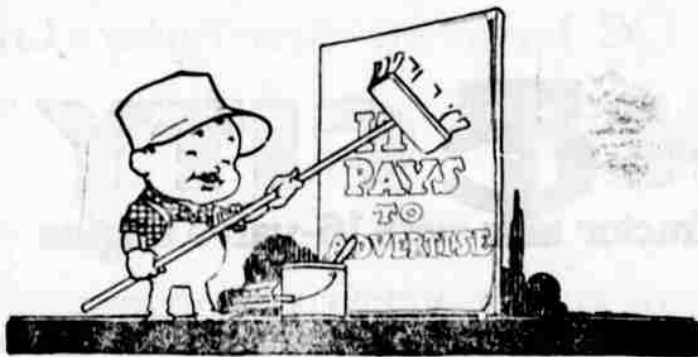

Annual Gathering is Held by the Association at Eugene

The Eugene Fruit growers association in the annual meeting of its 78 stockholders shows a great record for last year and adds strength to the statement that Eugene is the greatest cooperative city in Oregon.

The report of the year follows:

The Eugene Fruit Growers' association, which operates a cannery, an ice plant, a box factory, a vinegar factory, a large fruit evaporator and an ice cream factory, all in Eugene, besides canneries at Junction City and Creswell, increased its capital stock at the annual meeting of stockholders yesterday from \$100,000 to \$250,000. At present there are 781 stockholders in the association, an increase of 96 in the past year.

The annual report of J. O. Holt, manager, shows that business to the extent of \$949,475.73 was transacted by the association in 1919 and that the gross sales from the canneries, evaporators, ice plant and vinegar plant amounted to \$889,556.24.

The canned pack at the Eugene plant amounted to 68,073 cases, at Junction City 7220 cases and at Creswell, 5319 cases, making a total of

80,576 cases. The total number of boxes of green apples and pears handled at Eugene, Junction City, Creswell, Irving and Aldavore by the association, was 32,944. The output of the box factory was 266,465 boxes, and 25,000 gallons of vinegar was manufactured.

The total number of pounds of fruit and vegetables canned and dried at the Eugene plant in the year was 5,527,672, at Junction City, 343,158 and at Creswell 636, 531, making a total for the three plants of 6,507,361.

Lieut. A. C. Baker, after visiting his family here, left this noon for Kerry, Columbia county where he has accepted a position as assistant superintendent of construction of the Columbia and Nehalem rail road. Mr. Baker will continue to make his home in Albany where his children are in school.
