King George Is Strongly Behind Saving Movement

LONDON.—King George sent a message of encouragement to a meeting in London the other day of the National Savings Assembly, the body which was instrumental during the war in raising large sums of money by means of War Saving Certificates. "Your work is needed as much now and in the future as it was during the

war", says the royal message. "It will be your endeavor to explain and to encourage the reduction of unnecessary consumption and the increase of production in order that the whole national standard of living may be improved".

Sir Robert Kindersly, the chairman, announced that since the armistice 124,000,000 pounds worth of War Savings Certificates had been sold.

Mexican Natives Experience First Snow for Years

MEXICO CITY.—It is possible on almost any day in the year to see snow banks from Mexico City, yet few of the natives here had ever touched it until the other day when there was quite a perceptible fall, the first in many years in the Valley of Mexico. The mountain peaks of Popocatepetl and Iztaccihuatl, clearly visible from the capital, are always snow clad but they are some 60 miles away. Barefooted or lightly-shod natives

stepped gingerly into the strange element and afterward spent most of the day huddled in their homes or in sheltering nooks and corners. The snow flurry was due to a sudden drop in temperature during a light rain.

FORD EMPLOYEES IN ON CHEAP FOOD PLAN

Special Stores Sell Staples
At Cost to All Enrolled
In Organization

Mr. D. L. Graves, the local Ford manager, has just received word from Detroit that the Ford Motor Company have taken steps to reduce the high cost of living for their employees by establishing three stores from which groceries and other necessities are to be sold at cost. One of these stores is located at the Ford plant where approximately 5000 work and another at the parent plant in which 55,000 are now engaged.

In the main store at the Ford factory the stock consists of a line of staple groceries medical supplies, workmen's clothing and meats. The stores are run on the cash and carry plan and the customers bring baskets to save the expense of wrapping the articles. Expense is held to a minimum. Customers enter one door, pass along the counter, choose their articles, pay for them and leave through another door. While the saving varies, it averages easily from 8 to 20 percent. While the stores have been created especially for Ford workers, customers who are other than these have not been turned away.

Carload quantities of food are often secured at great savings and then special sales are held. The first sale ever held in the factory store resulted in a sale of more than 35,000 pounds of pork in one day. Many of the workers bought halves and some bought whole pigs at a saving of about 16 per cent on the market price. Special sales of beef, chickens, ham, bacon, apples and other commodities are handled in the same manner.

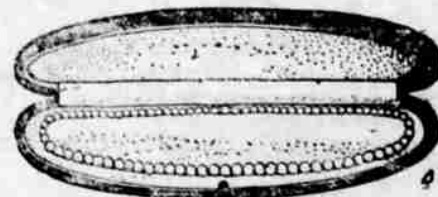
