SAFETY MEETING IS HELD TODAY

S. P. Employees Visited by
Committee of Officials
of Portland

The Portland division of the Southern Pacific company is holding its monthly safety meeting in this city at the round-house today, starting at 1 o'clock. The meetings are held at different points along the line each month for the purpose of encouraging the employees of the company in being care against accidents both on the part of the public and other employees of the company.

Talks are made by officials and men and suggestions are heard for the purpose of learning new methods of preventing accidents. The general committee makes the regular trip and unsafe conditions and practices are gone into.

Attending the meeting today are A. T. Mercier, superintendent; D. M. McLaughlin, master mechanic; H. M. Lull, division engineer; E. Stroud, lead foreman of engines; C. B. Baker, division examiner; J. L. May, train master; all of Portland, and S. T. Scott, road master, of the city.

Following the meeting today Mrs. Humphrey, who is demonstrating Oregon products, will serve lunch to the men.

Figures presented today show that during 1919 532 automobiles were damaged or destroyed by trains, one-half of which attempted to cross the track in front of approaching trains, while 137 ran into the side of trains. Five crossing flagmen were run down by approaching autos and 31 crossing gates were run into.

In 1918 54 people were killed in automobile-train accidents and 173 were injured. In 1919 46 were killed and 178 injured. Following is the summary for 1919:

Ran onto track in front of trains, 263; ran into side of trains, 137; stalled engines on track, 73; skidded into side of train, 9; ran into crossing gates, 31; ran into crossing flagman, 5; miscellaneous, 14.

Through the spread of anti-accident propaganda the number of accidents has been materially lowered, especially on the part of employees of the rail road company, but there seems to be a growing carelessness on the part of automobile drivers. The public is slow to listen to the dangers of driving onto train tracks, say officials, and more work is yet to be done along this line.

MIXED MARRIAGES SUBJECT OF TALK BY FATHER LANE

Speaking on the subject of Mixed Marriage at St. Mary's church last night, Father Lane said in part:

"These marriages are not in favor with the Catholic church, and I think I may add without fear of mistake that they are not in favor with any Protestant denomination. This attitude implies neither animosity nor ill-feeling on the part of the Catholic church. The viewpoint taken by both sides, I think is the same, and is perfectly logical and correct—that such alliances very frequently lead to religious indifference, to a very imperfect education of the children with a net loss in the end to both churches.

"We are happy to say that there are exceptions to this condition and every one knows them and recognizes that they are well characterized by unusual religious sincerity and steadfastness. It is only fair however to say that any one who is about to take a Catholic as a life companion, should know a little something about the Catholic belief and practice, lest he awake some day to find that he is up against a very distasteful situation.

"The church in a spirit of fair play and justice requires that the non-Catholic youth take a brief course of instructions on these points two weeks before the marriage. The question of joining the Catholic church is another thing altogether, and this is and must be left to every one's own conscience."
