Buried Under the Floor.

An Abyssinian funeral is a very singular affair. When a new-born infant dies it is almost immediately buried under the floor. After the demise of an adult, the body is washed in water sweetened with honey, wrapped in a shroud, sewed up in a mat of braided straw, and laid upon a litter made of boughs cut from trees.

The lamentations of the relatives resound among the cliffs, and the news is rapidly communicated to all the people of the neighborhood, who at once set out to condole with the mourners.

As soon as they catch sight of the funeral procession they begin to weep and cry aloud. When they join it, the men range themselves on one side of the bier, the women on the other, and chant. When the religious ceremony is over, the corpse is buried in the churchyard.

Taking Blood Stains From Feathers.

Make a strong solution of salt in water, and saturate a large and thick cloth with it. Wrap feathers up in cloth and keep until blood gets soft. When soft rub out with gentle pressure, putting something hard under feathers with blood on, and rubbing with the back of a knife. Each feather must be done separately. Of course goose or other feathers for cushions or pillows may be put into a cotton bag and washed and dried, but a preliminary soaking in brine will be of advantage.

FUNDS ARE ASKED FOR HOME FOR AGED

Next week Oregon people will be given an opportunity to contribute to an essentially home charity when "Old Folks at Home Week" will be held, the object being to raise \$35,000 for the construction of a home for aged and worthy poor at Pisgah Colony near Seaside. Though residents of this state have been asked for large sums of late for various charities and worthy work of this character abroad, this is the first appeal that has been made to them to help their home folks.

Oregon is woefully lacking in places for the care of her indigent unfortunates. Though the state boasts with glowing pride of the wonderful stock that pioneered here and made possible the present day residents, and incidentally Oregon has a greater percentage of home born population than any other state in the union she has neglected to provide proper accommodation for the old folks who, through some hard buff of fortune are unable to care for themselves. Present day conditions of high living costs have tended to aggravate this situation, to a great extent, until at the present time Oregon finds itself confronted by a real problem.

The state of Oregon, through its charitable committees have endorsed the movement, and Portland and state business organizations have recognized the necessity for the work and endorsed the plan. Headquarters have been established in Room 617 Gasco building Portland, where Mrs. Louise Palmer Weber is campaign manager, and there full information as to the work now being done on the plans for the future, will be furnished.

Caribou.

Caribou, says the Handbook of Indians of Canada, published by the geographic board, is the common name of the North American reindeer, of which there are two chief species—the woodland caribou, and the barren-ground caribou. The word came into the English from the French of eastern Canada, where it is old, the writer, Sagard-Heudat using it in 1632, during the lifetime of Samuel de Champlain. The origin of the word is said to be Micmac, the language of the Indians who inhabited what are now the Maritime provinces. They were known as Micmacs. They had a word related to caribou, being the name of the deer, and it meant pawing or scratching, from the habit of the caribou pawing away the snow with its forelegs to find the food—chiefly moss—upon which it subsisted in winter. Formerly the word was often spelled cariboo, which gave name to the Cariboo district in British Columbia, famous for its gold mines.—Montreal Herald.

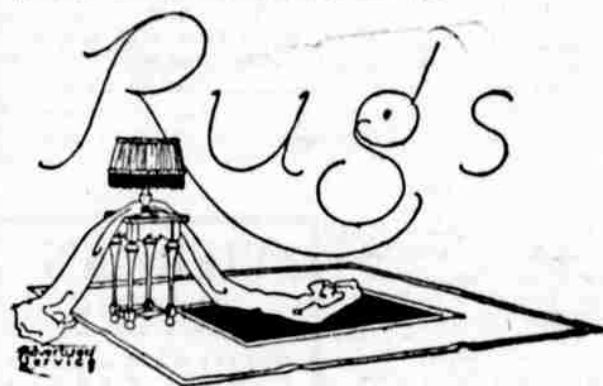
