Speaking of the contest Vice-president Thomas A. Marshall says:

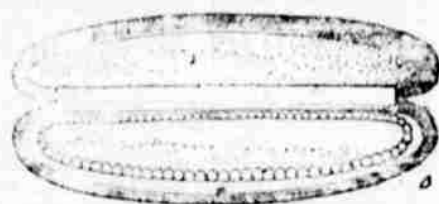
"I note with pleasure that it is your purpose to have a national essay contest on 'What are the Benefits of an Enlistment in the U. S. Army.'"
