## CHRISTIAN LIVING IS TAKEN AS TEXT FOR SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

"Peter writes about Christian Living." (I Peter 2:1-5, 11, 12, 19-25).

Golden Text — "He that saith he abideth in Him ought himself also to walk even as He walked." 1 John 2: 6.

Peter wrote the words of this lesson about 20 years after the events of our last Sunday's lesson, and during the time of the persecution of the Christians by the Roman government under Nero.

Notice the first two verses of the text: "Putting away therefore all wickedness, and all guile, and hypocrites, and all evil speakings, as new-born babes, desire the sincere milk of the word, that ye may grow thereby unto salvation."

Peter is talking to Christians here, and he reminds us that in "putting on" Christ, we are to "put off" some things, and he mentions some of the things. Paul gives us much the same thought in the words, "If any man be in Christ, he is a new creature. Old things are passed away. All things are become new."

John A. Hutton says, "The New Testament \* \* \* does not propose to make men a little happier, \* \* \* a little gentler \* \* \* a little better." No, the first great demand of Jesus was for regeneration. "Ye must be born again." And after this second birth, "of water and of the spirit," Peter says we're new born-babes, and we're to desire the spiritual milk, that we may grow thereby. What does he mean by this?

The messages of pure Christianity must be constantly taught, and its ideals must govern our lives. Otherwise we'll have only a dwarfed and misshapen spiritual body, as we grow up to spiritual manhood and womanhood. Or, rather, we'll never become spiritual men and women at all, but

only dwarfs.

In the 11th and 12th verses is a warning against worldliness. "I beseech you as strangers and pilgrims, to abstain from fleshly lusts, which was against the soul." The Israelites were forbidden to enter into the life or customs of the surrounding nations. And they prospered until they disobeyed this law. Christians are sojourners through this earth, on their way to the everlasting kingdom. It is their work to keep holy and undefiled the name of God and His church. How can they do this if they are to adopt the customs and thoughts and ways of the world. Talk about the "amusement" question. It would soon be settled for every Christian if each one would look at it in the light of this truth.

## KEEP WATCH ON GASOLINE PUMP

### Pointers Given to Motorists by National Automobile Chamber of Commerce.

## CONSERVE FUEL AND MONEY

### Twelve Excellent Rules Formulated for Benefit of Owners—Short Delivery is Likely if Details Are Overlooked.

Points for motorists to remember when purchasing gasoline have been formulated by the National Automobile Chamber of Commerce, with a view to conserving gas and saving money for the car owners. He is advised as follows:

1. Urge your dealer to make a daily test of the accuracy of his gasoline measuring pump with a standard five-gallon measure.
2. On pumps making one-gallon delivery, see that the pump operator makes a full stroke and that the piston travels its full length.
3. Watch the counter or indicating device on all pumps provided therewith.
4. See that the operator drains the delivery hose.
5. On pumps provided with graduated glass-cylinders, see that the gasoline reaches the proper graduation.
6. Beware of the filling stations where the delivery is outside and the pump inside the building.
7. Operators should willingly test pumps in the presence of the autoist with the five-gallon standard measure sealed by the local inspector of weights and measures.
8. Short delivery gasoline is sometimes caused by leaks in the supply line to the pump. This condition causes the pump to deliver air instead of gasoline and can be detected by the sputtering sound.
9. If the gasoline is low in the supply tank, short delivery is likely to result. This can be detected by the irregular flow of gasoline and the sputtering sound. Such a condition is frequently encountered where portable filling tanks are used.
10. The first delivery made by a pump after it has been standing idle for some time is invariably short. This is caused by the gasoline already in the measuring chamber leaking back into the dealer's supply tank through a leaky check valve.
11. View with suspicion a gasoline-delivery hose attached to a well in the curb. It is impossible to properly drain a hose so installed, and adequate measure cannot be obtained unless this is done.
12. In rare cases pumps may be deliberately manipulated to deliver short amounts through the changing of measuring adjustments.

## GOVERNMENT JOBS OPEN TO SOLDIERS

### Opportunities Offer to Those Willing to Work at Washington

Government jobs for honorably discharged soldiers and sailors as stenographers and typists are ready for all those who are willing to work in Washington, D. C., according to an announcement made today by Lieutenant Colonel Mathew C. Smith, of the Office of the Assistant to the Secretary of War.

This is the United States Civil Service Commission's answer to the complaint so often heard during the demobilization of the Army, that civilians and women filled the clerical places in Washington which should be given to returned fighting men. Ex-service men now have preference on all the lists, under the law.

The official bulletin reads: "The Government needs large numbers of stenographers and typists in Washington, D. C."

"Usual entrance salaries are \$1,000 to \$1,200 a year, plus the bonus of \$20 a month authorized by Congress. Higher-salaried positions are usually filled through promotion.

"The Homes Registration Bureau of the Community Service constantly maintains a list of available rooming and boarding places in Washington. Living conditions are considerably improved.

"Full information and application blanks may be obtained from the Secretary of the Local Board of Civil Service Examiners at the post office or customhouse in any city."

foreign nations attending the great council. George Clemenceau, chairman and premier of France, she described as a strong, rugged character, business like in every movement.

Lloyd George was mentioned as a man of real merit and always on the alert. The speeches were all translated into two languages, English and French. Each nation represented had large delegations of experts to consider every phase of the treaty as it might apply to the nation represented. An amazing feature of the conference was the different types of races represented and the many appeals made to the conference, and the United States from the oppressed of all lands.

All questions of importance were referred to committees appointed to consider certain lines of relationship, and but few general sessions were held. Twenty nations have already adopted the treaty which was designated as the back bone of future progress.

Miss Taftell was strong in her expressions of the approval of the treaty.
