PORTLAND TO BE SCENE OF THREE MEETS IN JUNE

Rose City Will be Mecca of Tourists During Three Conventions

The two weeks beginning June 15th and ending June 25th will be made notable by the coming to Portland, Oregon, of three great National conventions—the meeting of the Kiwanis Clubs of America, the national convention of the Traveling Men's Protective Association and the Forty-Sixth Annual Session of the Imperial Council of the Mystic Shrine. The first two will be attended by ordinary crowds, but the Shriners expect the largest assemblage that has ever visited the Pacific Coast. Caravans are already booked from meach of the 145 American cities where Shrine Temples exist, many will come from the Temples of Canada, and yet others from far off Honolulu and the Canal Zone.

The Shrine convention will be the most spectacular event ever staged in this country. Seventy-five bands and patrols of marching men will lend it color, each organization trying to pull some stunt that will outdo the others, and all of them bent on having as much fun as can be crowded into three days.

The Annual Rose Festival will follow the Shrine, and because of there being so many Eastern visitors in Portland the effort will be made to put on the finest show that the Rose growers have ever staged.

Realizing that many thousands of Northwest citizens will want to visit Portland to enjoy these spectacles and that the hotels cannot care for the crowds, the Shrine Committee is preparing to assign visitors to rooms in private homes of the city.
