NEW WARSHIP IS TO BE LAUNCHED

NEWPORT NEWS, Va., March 2—The superdreadnaught Maryland will be launched here March 20. She is the largest ship yet constructed for the navy, being 600 feet long, 97 feet broad, and having a displacement of 32,000 tons. Her main battery will be composed of eight 16-inch rifles, the heaviest guns used on a naval craft. The Maryland will be the first of a class of four similar ships to be followed by six 43,000-ton ships to carry 12 16-inch guns each, and with higher speed.
